GOLDEN NUGGETS FOR SALLOW PEOPLE

WATER IS ROILY

AND WILL CONTINUE SO UNTIL IMPROVEMENT WORK IS FINISHED.

Big Undertaking by Water Company to Insure Reliable Supply and Consumers Are Asked to Be Patient While It Progresses—Suggestions.

The housewives of Salem will be a little annoyed for a short period with roily water in their faucets, but if they will take the time to read the explanations which follow, they will be content to bear the temporary inconvenience in order to reach the good results which will follow.

It has been the desire of the Salem Water Company to give its patrons the best service within the reach of human effort, and to this end President Park has been planning a system of improvements for some time which would leave no room for doubt or misgiving as to the quality of water procured for and furnished to the people. His intention was outlined in the following letter to the secretary of the state board of health at Portland:

Salem, Or., April 13, 1906.—Dr. R. C. Yenny, Secretary State Board of Health, Portland, Oregon.—Dear Sir: We are contemplating the project of increasing the filtering system we have at Salem, and before we take any steps in this direction we desire to have you inspect the manner in which we filter and take the water, also to examine bacteriologically the water in our water mains and in the Willamette river adjacent to the filter.

In order to install the conduits incident to the filtration of the water, it is necessary for us to dig deep in the gravel sand bar with a steam dredger, which will for a short time open a channel direct from the river into the present filter crib.

While this work is being done we are extremely anxious to take every precaution to prevent any contamination of the water or impair the health of the community. To this end we respectfully ask your opinion as to the efficiency of our filter, the advisability of extending the same, and what precautions we can take to prevent any impairment of the health of the public. City Water Is Pure.

Mr. Park received the following reply yesterday, it having been delayed through the absence of Dr. Matson, the bacteriologist, who is spoken of in the letter, who was in San Francisco part of the time:
Portland, May 17, '06.—Mr. Chas. A. Park, Salem, Or.—Dear Sir: In reply to your letter will say that the water taken by Dr. Matson from the city main and from the river shows as follows:

The water from the main showed no growth of bacteria and for that reason is excellent water for domestic use.
The Willamette river water showed considerable growth of bacteria.

With regard to precautions that should be taken while enlarging your filters, will say that you should notify all persons to boil their drinking water while the work is in progress.

When the crib is completed thoroughly cleanse the reservoir and flush water mains and pipes. This will reduce the danger to the minimum.

An Immense Job.

The work spoken of by Mr. Park has been in progress some weeks and has reached a stage toward completion when of necessity the water in the mains will be discolored by sediment. The company concluded to extend the filter in the river by building a conduit 300 feet long, extending westward under the gravel bar, and to do this it was necessary to procure the use of the government dredge, which was done through the secretary of war and this dredge has been in operation here during the past three weeks. By means of this channel forty feet wide and in some places over twenty feet deep has been dug through the gravel bar for over three hundred feet, into which will be inserted a conduit through which the water will filter, and which is really just so much of an extension to the present crib and filter.

This conduit will be set eight feet below low water mark of the river and nearly four feet below the present bed of the stream. The ditch is cut through the gravel of the river bed to a hardpan cement and through this again to a bed of boulder gravel, apparently the old time river bed. Upon this the timbers of the conduit will rest and on top of it when completed will be the gravel bar ten to fifteen feet deep.

now dug close to the present filter, and today the intervening section of dirt will be removed and this disturbance of the gravel will naturally allow the river water to flow in and carry considerable foreign matter, which will startle the lady at the faucet. This disturbance will continue to a greater or less extent until the excavation is finished and the dredger out of the way so that the outer end of it can be filled in with gravel so as to shut out the river water.

To Avoid All Danger.

Mr. Park hopes that the people will bear this annoyance patiently. The company has taken every precaution and has no fear of contamination, or it would not let the water in, but all possible danger can be avoided by boiling the water used or drinking purposes until the improvement is completed.

Best Filtering System.

The company believes it has the best possible filtering system and that it cannot be improved upon. In fact, no system can be better than that which gives absolutely sterile water and that is what Salem is to be provided with and has been, according to the testimony of Dr. Matson, the bacteriologist.
