### Queen Alexandra's Yacht.

The entire scheme of decoration throughout this great vessel was arranged under the direct supervision of King Edward and Queen Alexandra. Simplicity is the note, and no attempt was made at anything gorgeous or oppressively elaborate. At the same time the fittings and decorations are quietly rich and sumptuous. For example, even on the upper deck, which is exposed to the severest weather and the action of the salt spray, solid silver is used for the deck fittings.

In the various suites of rooms a subdued yet dignified character has been obtained by employing an old 18th century English style. All the apartments are paneled in enameled white, while the necessary warmth of color is obtained in the furniture, carpets and draperies. In the king's private stateroom, for example, the carpet is a rich royal blue, which well matches the blue morocco of the chairs. All the furniture here is of grained mahogany, slightly inlaid with other woods.

As to the king's bedroom, it is severely simple, with its swinging bedstead of silver plate, without draperies; its satinwood furniture, silver plated metal work, and specially woven carpet. The queen's bedroom is much larger than the king's. It is decorated in the purest Adams style—a perfect model of grace and beauty, with its white paneling and stately canopied bed, with silken draperies, suspended from the ceiling. The furniture is of dainty grained satinwood with silver fittings.

The color scheme is of soft green, and, of course, the silk hangings and curtains as well as the upholstery are all in perfect harmony. The coverlet of the bed has an elaborate monogram surmounted by a crown. Queen Alexandra's dressing room is a very large

### Where Lions Prowl.

"On the Broken Hill road," says the Bulawayo Chronicle of an incident in that part of South Africa, "on a recent night a lion entered a but where-in were sleeping two white men. Pushing open the reed door the animal made for the nearer of the two sleepers, and, gripping him by the shoulder with his teeth, lifted him from his bed. The cries of the man brought several natives to the scene, and these pluckily attacked the beast, bringing it to bay. A shotgun happened, fortunately, to be near by, and this the captive succeeded in reaching, instantly shooting the lion. The man, whose name is Thornton, was very badly mauled, but he is making favorable progress."

In Rhodesia, too, the lions are troublesome. An Englishman named Marriott was playing tennis with a man named Fynn when news was brought in that a lion was attacking the mules. Both rushed for their guns and went in pursuit of the beast, which they sighted within a short distance of their home. Marriott fired and wounded the lion twice, but without fatal effect. The enraged beast charged him, and bit him severely on the thighs. His teeth also penetrated his hands and left shoulder. Fynn fired and killed the lion. Marriott was able to go home, but was ordered to the hospital, where he expired 24 hours later.

"At least eight lions have appeared in the districts of Moore's concession and Simmonia recently," says South Africa. "A farmer named Clayton on visiting his stable one morning, wherein the previous night he had tied up two mules, found nothing but bones. Two of these bones, it is since reported, have been killed in the neighborhood of the Yellow Jack mine."
