Preliminary Engineering for Line From Dallas to this City Done.

J. P. Van Ordel, county surveyor of Polk county, who is in the employ of the Dallas & Falls City railroad, is in the city with his corps of engineers. He will today complete the preliminary survey of the extension of the road from Dallas to Salem. The next step in the progress of this railroad building will be to acquire the right of way and then make the permanent survey. About 15 miles of this line has already been built and is in operation. Mr. Rhodes of the Philadelphia firm of Rhodes, Sinkler & Butcher, who are also interested in the road, are also in the city.

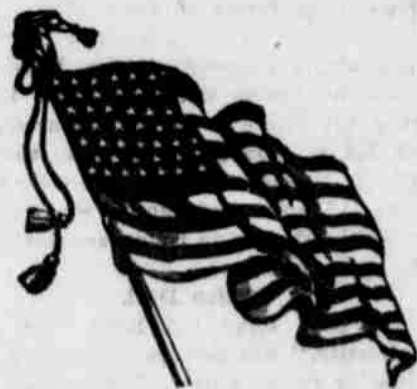
