WILL GROW STONELESS PLUM

Salem Firm Purchases From Burbank Rights to Grow and Propagate Fruit Marvel.

Oregon is to introduce to the world Luther Burbank's latest fruit creation—the stoneless plum. The Oregon Nursery company of Salem has purchased from the wizard the rights to grow and propagate this marvel.

The stoneless plum has been given the name "Miracle." When eminent horticulturists first tried the plum at Mr. Burbank's place they pronounced it a miracle that such a fine fruit could be grown without a stone. The Miracle plum was perfected about a year ago by Mr. Burbank, after more than sixteen years of experimenting.

The parentage of the Miracle plum is interesting. First of all Mr. Burbank sent to France and secured a French plum of dwarfish habit, leaving a very small, partially stoneless fruit, not much larger than a good-sized bean. The staminate parent is the well-known French prune (Petite d'Agnon), a hardy tree bearing immense crops of sweet fruit. By crossing and re-crossing, covering years of labor, the Miracle was produced. It is inclined to branch low, forming a compact head. Its foliage is dark green. The fruit itself resembles the Damson type of plums, except that the "stone" is represented by a simple fragment or spicule near the stem end, the kernel otherwise lying imbedded in the delicious pulp. The plum as a whole can be bitten or cut through in any direction without interference.

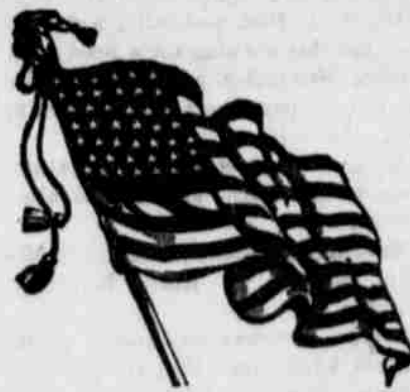
