New Banking House for Havana.

New York, June 25 .- Interests iden tified with the National City bank, with which are associated important London and Paris interests, are organizing a new financial institution in Havana, to be known as the Banque de la Havana. The bank, which will be chartered under the laws of Cuba, is to have a paid-up capital of \$2,500,000. It is expected that it will begin operations in the early fall. 


