TWENTY THOUSAND HOP PICKERS COMING

Great Preparations Are Being Made for Gathering the Crop in Marion and Polk Counties

Within the next two months, there will be within a radius of twelve or fifteen miles of Willamette valley country...

Hops around Salem, both in Marion and Polk counties, are looking well and unless something unforeseen occurs the output will be large.

Notwithstanding the prevailing low prices of hops and the losses that were sustained by some of the growers last year, the amount of capital invested in the industry is so enormous that every effort will be used to facilitate the harvesting of the crop.

On the Marion county side across the Willamette from Independence is an area of 700 acres of hops. This includes the yards of George Rose, Henry Ottenheimer, Percival, Damon, Cooper Graves, Fennel, Mix, Smith and others.

There was a scarcity of pickers last year throughout the entire season. This was so extensive that some of the hops were injured before they were gathered.

The two largest hop yards in the United States are near Independence—the Krebs yard, four miles south, and the Clement Horst yards, four miles north.

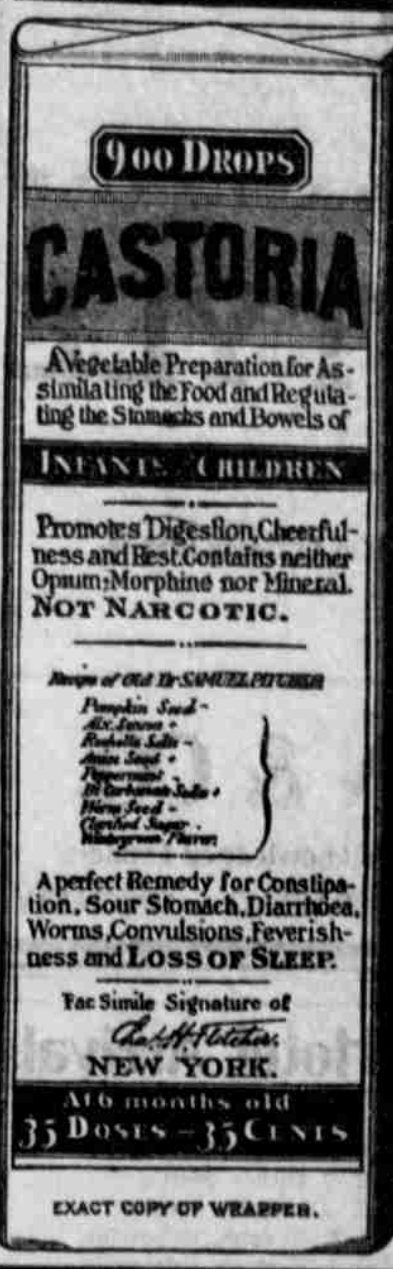
