Hundreds of waitresses in the temporary restaurants and at such resorts as the Oaks usually are glad to hie themselves to the valley on the first of September and try the beauties of the simple life for a couple of months, while regaling themselves in the hop yards at \$3 per day.

The Clement Horst yards have already engaged 400 pickers and are now receiving five or six letters a day from people who desire to assist in saving this year's crop.


