THE ANGOORA INDUSTRY

Mohair Pays Better Than Wool in Utah.

In several parts of Idaho experiments are being made in the raising of Angora goats and of late there have been some encouraging reports.

The Angora goat is a hardy first and a good climber, and the higher he can get on the rocky cliffs the better he seems to thrive.

Aside from the animal's value as a producer of mohair, his meat is said to be superior to lamb. Flocks of fall-grown Angoras make splendid floor rugs.

The first carload of mohair ever shipped out of Utah is moving east over the Rio Grande and Santa Fe, it being consigned direct to the mills in Maine.

Mohair, which is shorn from the backs of Angora goats, apparently is a better money maker than wool. While fashion and demand regulate the price, there is possibly not 1,000,000 pounds grown in the United States.

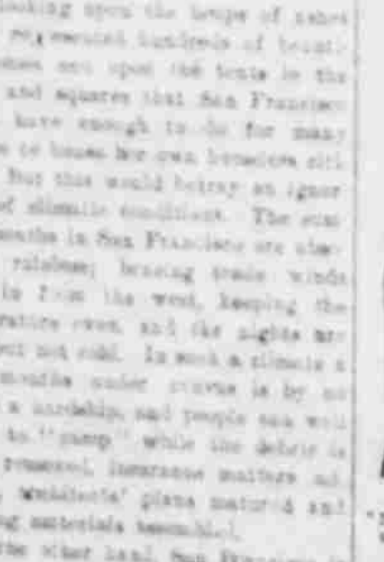
State Institutions
