WEATHER REPORT

The week was dry except Saturday, when clouds formed and in a number of places thunder storms occurred, with very light rain. In the coast counties the nights and mornings were generally cloudy or foggy and the afternoons clear.

The temperature averaged above normal, with the coolest weather during the closing days of the week. In the Willamette valley the warmest day was Friday, when the maximum temperature was above 90 degrees.

The winds were generally light and their prevailing direction was northwesterly.

Coast District. Bay City, Tillamook county, Captain J. J. Dawson—During the week dense fogs were prevalent in the early morning hours, but the remainder of the day was generally clear and cool.

Toledo, Lincoln county, Otto K. Krogstad—The days were clear, except in the fore part of the week, but the nights were cool and foggy.

Fairview, Coos county, Wm. Betts—The weather was clear during the week. Moderate northwest winds prevailed.

Willamette Valley. Portland, Multnomah county, Local Office, Weather Bureau—The week was clear and warm, except Saturday, when a thunder storm occurred, with a very light fall of rain.

Forest Grove, Washington county, D. J. Taylor—The week was warm and clear, Friday being the warmest day; on Saturday a trace of rain fell.

Corvallis, Benton county, F. W. McOmbs—The weather during the week was moderately warm, with a steady breeze blowing from the west during the afternoons.

Southern Oregon. Drain, Douglas county, Ira Wimberly—The weather was dry and warm. Tuesday and Friday being the warmest days.

Grant's Pass, Josephine county, J. B. Paddock—Clear skies prevailed during the week. High maximum temperatures were recorded during the day, but the nights were cool.

Ashland, Jackson county, F. H. Carter—The weather during the week was clear, warm and dry.

Roseburg, Douglas county, Local Office, Weather Bureau—Clear skies prevailed throughout the week, except on Sunday morning. No rain occurred.

Kerby, Josephine county, E. P. Mohaner—The week was hot and dry. The prevailing winds were from the north.

JOAQUIN MILLER. Poet of the Sierras Will Locate on the Siuslaw.

Eugene, Or., Aug. 1.—Soon the "poet of the Sierras" may be known

as the "sweet singer of the Siuslaw." Joaquin Miller, who is known by his writings from coast to coast, is in Portland. Accompanied by his massive beard, his unshorn locks and his picturesque garb, the word painter has arrived in Oregon.

Now, Joaquin Miller returns to his own people. He has bought a place on the banks of the turgid Siuslaw, where everything is beautiful and only man is vile. In this beautiful spot the poet will recreate and write. It will be his summer home, for in the winter he will fly south to his cottage at Fruitvale, California.

It is an ideal retreat for him, and the poet is determined to extract all the enjoyment possible from it. His visit to Portland is but a stopover affair, for Joaquin is now on his way east to consult with publishers.

Baggage on Newport tickets checked through to Newport; on Yaquina tickets to Yaquina only Sunday excursions to Newport on the C. & E. will begin June 10th or 17th and run every Sunday thereafter, leaving Albany at 7:20 a. m., leave Corvallis at 8 a. m.

S. P. trains connect with the C. & E. at Albany and Corvallis for Yaquina and Newport. Trains on the C. & E. for Detroit will leave Albany at 7:30 a. m., enabling tourists to the hot springs to reach there the same day. Trains from and to Corvallis connect with all east side trains on the S. P.
