REFORM SCHOOL BOYS

Knocked Out Two Farmers and Robbed Jefferson Store

Ernest Evans and Roy Espey, the two boys who ran away from the reform school Sunday afternoon, are creating a kind of miniature reign of terror along the Santiam river and in the neighborhood of Jefferson.

They broke open the store of Smith & Jones, at Jefferson, last night and took some clothing and a lot of other things. That is, the theft is supposed to have been committed by these boys.

Evans was sent to the reform school a short time ago from Roseburg, and is said to be a refugee from California. He is 17 years old, and is a bad boy.

Espey was sent to the school from Portland, and would have gone to the penitentiary instead had he been a few months older.

Late in the night the boys crossed over into Linn county again, tried to buy bread and stole a peck of apples.

Mr. Bruer, of the reform school, and Constable John Catlin have been on the boys' trail for two days.

Boys Are Captured.

Superintendent Looney received a message by wire this afternoon that the two boys have been apprehended, near Jefferson, and have been placed under arrest.

Colwell Seeking Pardon.

Governor Chamberlain has received a petition asking for the pardon of James Colwell, who was jointly indicted with George S. Miller and Burt Bailey for the crime of murder for the killing of Warren Curtis, alleged to have been committed March 22, 1902, in Harney county.

The indictment against Burt Bailey was dismissed, and George S. Miller secured a change of venue to Crook county in May, 1906, and was acquitted.

James Colwell became insane during the progress of the trial, and was unable, it is now stated, to give his side of the case in a proper manner.

The petition presented is headed by Tom Allen, ex-sheriff, and a prosecuting witness at the trial, and the officials of Harney county, and nearly all the citizens of Burns.

DOG PELTERS ENJOINED BY A. SMITH

Webster Holmes Brings Suit to Save Lives of "Stub" Smith's Canines

Perhaps, after all, the municipal sausage factory will not be organized.

Web Holmes has brought a suit against the poundmaster and dog catcher, W. W. Johnson, and has secured a temporary injunction from County Judge Scott, restraining the dog pelter from interfering with the liberty of "Stub" Smith's female dogs.

Until this suit is decided in department No. 2 of the Marion county circuit court, Poundmaster Johnson must rest on his laurels, and the nine dogs of Mr. Smith will be permitted to roam the streets of the Capital City, care free and unmolested, and to bay merry rondelays at the moon at their own sweet will.

It is said that Mr. Smith will keep one of his string of thoroughbred dogs in the city as a base for litigation, and the others have made a grand hegira beyond the corporate lines of Salem.

In the complaint filed in the clerk's office today by Attorney Webster Holmes, on behalf of his client, A. Smith, it is alleged that the act of the council, recently adopted, known as the dog law, is unlawful, inasmuch as the city charter does not confer on the city the authority to license dogs, nor to enforce any regulations with reference to the same whatever.

Furthermore it is alleged that the ordinance is void, because it is unreasonable, arbitrary and oppressive in providing for the manner in which female dogs must be kept and cared for, and violates the fullest enjoyment of private property, contrary to the constitution of Oregon and of the United States.

The plaintiff alleges that there are a great number of dogs in Salem, and that they are of unequal value, and that to place a tax on them of \$3 for male dogs and \$5 for female dogs is unequal taxation, and, as such, is contrary to the letter and the spirit of the constitution.

Mr. Smith avers that the dog over which he is bringing suit is worth \$25, besides the great value by way of natural attachment which the plaintiff has for the beast.

County Judge Scott granted the temporary injunction asked for this morning.

The act to amend the act to incorporate the city of Salem, enacted by the legislature in 1903, on pages 343 and 344 gives to the council the power to license and regulate, among other things, "dog tags."

The charter has no more to say on the subject of dogs, dog taxes, dog licenses, etc.

This is the only canine legislation mentioned in the charter.

In the trial of this famous case, the court must interpret this clause, and decide whether this is a typographical error, or whether the council has power to regulate the tags, but not the dogs.

In this case a decision may cause the tag to wag the dog.

by Oregon Capital.

The company will sell real estate, and will irrigate in township 5 south, range 10 east, in Wasco county, on the right bank of White river in said county.
