CONTRACT GOES TO C. A. GRAY

Salem Firm Will Make Improvements on State Asylum

Contracts for the improvements and additions to the main building of the state insane asylum, and for painting and cement pointing of the outer walls of the main building and painting the roofs, were awarded to Charles A. Gray, of Salem, for \$27,086. The contract for building improvements and repairs was let for \$16,998 and for painting and cement pointing for \$10,088. The latter includes the painting of the physicians' cottages. Rasmussen & Co., of Portland, received the contract for furnishing the mixed paint at \$1.05 per gallon.

The board discovered that the amounts of the lowest bids exceeded the appropriation, and it was necessary to cut out one proposed new lavatory, and the completion of the quarantine station.
