Salem Mutual Cannery Working Full Blast and Crowded for Room

More than a hundred people were working at the Salem Mutual Cannery yesterday, canning pears and the plant will shut down in order that all the employees might have an opportunity to attend the school tomorrow, the plant will open at its full capacity and will continue in operation every day until the weather is cold. There are thousands of pounds of pears packed up in the cannery and tons of cans stored away ready for use. President Holcomb, of the Cannery company, said today that he expects that it would be absolutely necessary for the company to build additional room to the buildings even for the remainder of this year's business. The management expects to can thousands of cases of apples in the sizes and if this is done it will be almost a necessity that more room be added to the plant.

A CRANK THREATENS GOVERNOR

Man from Michigan Will Sue Chamberlain for \$25,000

If Governor Chamberlain loses his job and then has to pay a fellow in Michigan \$25,000, he will be up against the real thing.

A fellow named Thomas Robinson from Detroit, Michigan, says because the governor refused to let him come in the executive office and because of the long delay in locating him, he lost a big legacy. Now, so the dispatches say, he is going to sue Governor Chamberlain for \$25,000 and besides that will institute an action to oust the governor from office.

The dispatch referred to is as follows: Detroit, Mich., Aug. 21.—Thomas Robinson, globe trotter, has undertaken the difficult task of ousting the governor of Oregon from his job. In a visit to Detroit he has engaged attorneys to begin suits in the United States court against the executive and declares that he will spend his entire estate in the prosecution of the suits. Robinson has also arranged to bring a damage suit for \$25,000 against the governor as an individual.

Robinson was a resident of Oregon when a year ago he learned of the death of an aunt in St. Mary's, Michigan. She had died four years before leaving Robinson a legacy of \$8200, but the executors had been unable to locate the heirs.

"I went to San Francisco and saw Governor Pardee," declares Robinson. "He advised me to place the matter before Governor Chamberlain of Oregon and ask his assistance. I did so and was promised the aid of the state department. Nothing was ever done and after a long delay I was refused admission to the executive offices.

"At a great financial loss I came back to St. Mary's only to learn that my delay had lost me the legacy. Under the terms of the will the heirs had to be found within a certain period.

"The governor was derelict in his duty and by his actions forfeited his right to the executive chair."

Referring to this state of affairs, Governor Chamberlain this morning said:

"I do not now recall anyone by the name of Thomas Robinson nor do I remember any one coming here to ask about an eastern estate. One thing, however, I am positive about and that is no man, woman or child, was ever denied admittance to the executive office; and that being given as a fact leads me to believe that no such person ever called on me for the purpose mentioned.

"I do not mind the payment of a little claim like \$25,000, I can pay that at any time; but it would be too bad to be ousted from office."

Iowa Hibernians Meet.

Emmetsburg, Ia., Aug. 22.—Several thousand members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians are assembled here to attend the state convention of the order, which opened here this morning with a large attendance. The delegates and members assembled at Hibernian hall at half past nine this morning and marched to Assumption church, where they attended high mass. Immediately after mass the delegates proceeded to the convention hall, where they were formally welcomed by the mayor of Emmetsburg, Mr. T. F. Shea, the state secretary of the order and Mr. P. H. Doulon. After a short session a recess was taken. There will be another session after dinner and in the evening a special dramatic performance at the opera house. Tomorrow the delegates and their ladies will take a trip to Spirit Lake and Lake Okoboji.

PRUNES RIPEN EARLY

Drying Will Begin First of September, Ten Days Earlier Than Usual

The prune crop in this section of the Willamette valley has been ripening rapidly in the past week and the present outlook is that drying will begin in the earliest yards by the first of September. This is a week or ten days earlier than usual. In the hill yards south of this city picking will begin from one to two weeks later. Growers are now engaging their pickers and the men and women to work in the dryer. It was expected that there would be great difficulty in getting people to work in the prune orchards, but most of the growers report that they are getting help as easily as usual, chiefly from among the residents of their neighborhood.

The cooler weather will be beneficial to the crop, for it will retard ripening and give the fruit more time to make growth. This is important in the prune crop for the larger the size of the prunes the higher the price per pound. A week ago some of the growers were hoping for rain but now they are in doubt about a rain doing more good than harm. The trees are pretty well loaded with fruit and also have heavy foliage. If a heavy rain should come the fruit and leaves would hold so much moisture that many of the limbs would break.

The prune market seems to be at a stand-still, for the reason that dealers are not offering a price for the 40-50 size, which will probably be the largest size this year with most growers. Those growers who sold early were able to make contracts about a cent a pound better than this. Growers generally believe that the market is now lower than the conditions warrant and that there will be a reaction when the crop is ready for delivery. At any rate, they do not see any probability of its going lower and are waiting until they have their prunes ready to sell.

Growers are now busy getting their dryers in working order.
