RAILROAD TO NEWPORT.

That City Grants Franchise and Building Operations Are to Begin at Once.

Manager Guy W. Talbot, of the Corvallis & Eastern railroad, accompanied by his party, returned at an early hour yesterday morning from Newport where on Tuesday evening he appeared before the city council and secured the franchise for the extension of the railroad into the city of Newport. The case of the road was presented to the council by Mr. Talbot, J. K. Weatherford and Judge McFadden and the required franchise was readily granted.

This will be the signal for the early beginning of operations for the extension of the road from Yaquina City around the bay to the city of Newport. The company owns steam shovels and other necessary machinery for the work and these will be promptly put to use. Work on the road is to begin at once and by the opening of next season at the seaside the new road will have its terminus in the city of Newport.

The delay incident to the transfer of large crowds from the train to the steamer will be avoided and the run around the bay will be made in far less time than it takes the steamer to cross in the face of a tide.

It is believed that the completion of the road around the bay will increase the seaside travel 50 per cent and it will reduce the time between the valley and Newport and the beaches by considerable.

In connection with the extension of the road it is whispered that next season, two passenger trains each way will be run daily between this city and Newport. One to leave here at 7 a. m., or thereabouts, and returning leave Newport at 5 or 6 p. m., carrying passengers exclusively, the other to run on about the schedule of the present daily bay train. With such a service it is pointed out, the business of the road and the resorts, along the bay would be materially increased. It is likely that some such changes will be made.—Albany Herald.
