THE COUNTY ASSESSMENTS.

Marion, Polk and many other counties have doubled and trebled the valuation of property for purposes of assessment and taxation.

What will be done with counties like Clackamas **THAT HAVE MADE NO INCREASE IN VALUATION?** A state board is needed to equalize the counties.

The assessed value of taxable property in Polk county this year will exceed \$8,000,000. The total amount of taxable property will be between \$8,740,000 and \$8,750,000. The total taxable property last year amounted to \$4,035,000.

The increased valuation this year was made by Assessor Graves in accordance with the agreement of the assessors of the several counties to bring all classes of property nearer to cash value. The recent decision of the supreme court declaring the exemption law unconstitutional will add several hundred thousand dollars to Assessor Graves' original assessment.

Members of the legislature should be prepared to deal with this problem as it **WILL WORK GREAT INJUSTICE** to have property in one county assessed at half the value of another right alongside of it.

STUDENTS OF THE BIBLE.

The former took certain Southern states away from him; the latter, by drawing votes away to Birney, gave New York to Polk. Clay had the support of the moderate and conservative classes; but it was an issue that tolerated no dodging. Never was there so keen disappointment as over his defeat. Friends who called to console with Clay got the answer: "I would rather be right than be president."—Oregonian.

Pipe Line in Danger.

Last night's Telegram says: Rain last night and this morning stopped a fire which endangered the 30 miles of pipe line through which the waters of Bull Run are conveyed to Portland. Yesterday afternoon, so reports state, United States Forest Inspector B. D. Bronson and a full crew of expert fire fighters feared that the headworks of the reserve would be destroyed by the flames, but the opportune showers saved the city's water supply for the time being.

The line, however, is not yet out of danger. The pipe extends 30 miles from the headworks into the city, and for 10 miles destruction of the line by fire is not improbable when the forests are burning. Mr. Bronson will not be back from the reserve for several days, and until then the extent of the damage will not be known.
