# HOUSEHOLD TOPICS FOR SEPTEMBER

## Now Is the Time of Preparation for Winter

Refitting and Refurbishing Homes for the Year—The Newest Ideas in Draperies and Wall Decorations—Return of the Lambrequin and Cornice.

With the advent of autumn comes the end of vacations and the gathering of the family into the home, once more to begin the serious business of life, playtime being over for the year.

September is a busy month for the mother and housewife, for in addition to the solution of the question of school clothes for the young members of the family, the house must be set in order for the winter. She will find many temptations in the shops, for taste in home decoration is growing more and more artistic every year, and the makers and vendors of all sorts of goods for the purpose employ their best efforts to cater to improved conditions and satisfy the new demand.

### The Latest in Curtains.

The lace curtains of the season include, in addition to the staple Tambour and Irish point, a wide variety of handmade curtains. Cluny, Arabian, Flemish, Renaissance and Egyptian laces are used, alone or in combination, applied to net, fine batiste or scrim. Of course the Nottingham lace curtains have their usual place in fall lines and some of them are really beautiful, as they follow the square motif, approved by fashion this season, and also come in a wide variety of new designs that are more or less attractive and resemble the latest ones in the Tambour and Brussels lace curtains.

### Lambrequins and Cornices.

Really a fashion needs but a short season of repose when it is always sure to return. This is exemplified in the revival of the lambrequin and the cornice. In your process of furnishing your home for the winter, dear ladies, you can lay aside your curtain poles and rings; and if you have any old-time gilt cornices of colonial style, with prongs to match for looping back the curtains, stored away in a corner of your attic, hunt them up. Make lambrequins of cloth or silk about eight inches deep, cut straight on the edges or with a shield in the center, and border them with silk braid the same shade attach these to your cornices, hang them in window dressing for your best rooms, unless you wish to have, in addition to the lambrequins, heavy draperies of rich stuffs over the lace curtains; in that case they, and the lambrequin should be of the same material, brocade, plain taffeta or velours.

### Bed Room Curtains.

The draperies described in the foregoing are for the reception room, drawing room, living room, or library; for the bed room more dainty draperies for windows are required and curtains of washable fabrics are preferable. Ruffled muslins, lace edged or with a simple hem, are still popular and the fancy sheer madrases, in white or ecru, and dotted swisses are much liked for the purpose.

Some housewives like bed rooms trimmed throughout with cretonne, a pleasing pattern in a favorite color combination is chosen and the curtains, bed cover, table covers, bureau scarf and mats, slipper case, laundry bag, hold-all, etc., are made of the same. The rose pattern in natural colors is frequently chosen and a roof so decorated resembles a veritable bower of roses.

### Wall Hangings.

Unquestionably plain cartridge paper with a picture molding near the top is the most tasteful choice for a room in which pictures are to be hung, and the tone of it should harmonize with the color in draperies and floor coverings. Panels of plain satin striped paper between those that are covered with rose garlands is a popular combination; the rose paper frames the top of the panel as well, and the flowers and leaves are cut out on the edges so as to extend naturally over the plain panels. Satin striped paper with a landscape frieze is one of the latest ideas, but needs the exercise of good judgment in selection, as the size of the room and height of the ceiling must be taken into consideration. Choose yellow papers for north rooms as they have an effect of sunshine. Large patterned papers are correct for bed rooms

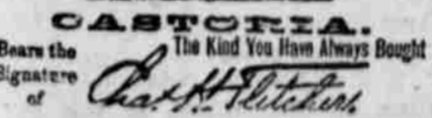
### She Got the Right Man.
