TOUCHES
TURNER
RIGHT

As first surveyed the Salem and Mehama electric line would not have accommodated the Turner tabernacle for its immense assemblages during the times of campmeetings and other gatherings. The line was surveyed just around the point of the hill on the other side of the creek about a quarter of a mile from the entrance, and would have left the tabernacle away off to one side.

The Journal write-up of the new line called attention to this, and by a conference between the local representative of A. Welch and Lewis Turner an adjustment has been made so that the line will go right past the corner of the grounds, and

the grounds and the building are to be lighted with electricity. As a result the new line secures about two and a half miles of right of way through the city of Turner and the Turner lands, a very valuable concession, and the tabernacle will have an electric line to its doors, and have the convenience of electric lighting free as soon as a transmission wire is put on its poles.
