BOWERS OL SPOKANE BRUTALLY HAZED BY WILLAMETTE JUNIORS

Because He Was a White Winged Delta, Wore a Green Sweater and Peglegged Trousers and Rooted for Whitman and Bet His Money Forsooth and Had the Temerity to Win, He Was Beaten and Ducked; Then He Was Made to Beg Pardon for Not Dying

Perhaps it was because he wore a green sweater with white wings on it; because he was a new frat, a "White Winged Delta," and a dunder; perhaps it was owing to his peg legged white corduroy breeches with yellow leather rims; perhaps it was because he had the temerity to root for Walla Walla at the game, perhaps it was because he bet on Whitman and won some \$30 of good Willamette money; perhaps it was because of a medley of all these potent reasons; perhaps it was, because they wanted to, that some Willamette's football and athlete squad kidnapped Paul Bower, of Spokane, brutally beat him and then carried him to the big ditch in the campus grounds and plunged him beneath the ley waves.

Anyway that's what he got. There is a halo of mystery surrounding the bazing of Paul Bowers as there has been about a great many university happenings of late. Bowers is a Spokane boy. He applauded the Walla Walla boys during the football game Wednesday. Most of them were old school mates of his and he felt as if it were no disloyalty for him to do so. Then he bet on Whitman and what is worse, he won.

Wednesday night, the sweet girl undergraduates gave a reception to the Whitman boys in Lausanne hall. It was during the festivities that two juniors rushed in and grabbed a Whitman boy and had started out with him. It is said that Rader, a member of the losing team said: "You have the wrong man; who do you want?"

"We want Bower," was the reply. It is said that Bower was then pointed out and the boys took him to the outside and that Professor Boyer then closed the door. There are different versions of this and some say that Boyer and another professor were at the other end of the hall and knew nothing of the contemplated outrage.

When Bower found himself in the hands of a score or more of juniors, he tried to fight for his liberty and succeeded in landing some kicks and blows on several of his assailants. In the fight, however, he was brutally overpowered and beaten by his brave captors and after sausage meat was made of his visage, he was carried, or rather dragged by his courtly and chivalrous school mates to the big canal that flows near the hall and was thrown in head first and allowed to come out the best he could.

The matter was reported to the faculty yesterday morning but it has not yet been made public whether any action will be taken or not.

There is a great deal of mystery about some of the subsequent developments. It was given out last night that Bower was taken before the football team and was taken in hand by Professor Boyer, who seems to have been mixed up in the matter all along and was made to apologize to the team for something. It is not known whether was forced to ask pardon for cheering for the players from his own state, winning money from the Salem boys or for getting out of the creek alive.

There was some talk that the team, after it was so badly beaten by the Whitman boys, accused Bower of giving its signals away. It is said that Bower had no possible opportunity of knowing any signals.

Some say that the advent of the new "frat," the White Winged Delta, was the root of the whole trouble. Some time ago several of the boys who had, or thought they had, a little more money or blood than the common herd, organized the new society. They are accused of putting on airs and wearing peg-legged breeches with leather rims around the bottom. They were too aristocratic for anything, and the soul of the yeoman and yokel student stood aghast at the advent of caste into the Jauch Lee circle of society. "No up-

per crust in, ours" got to be a sort of rallying cry. But the idea of caste grew worse. Some of the boys had a chant like this:

"The poor benighted Hindoo,
Does the best he kin do.
He sticks to his caste, from the first
to the last;
And for pants he makes his skin
do."

And it is said that Bowers was a member of the feared and hated White Winged Delta.

But the green sweaters still continue to be worn.

Coleman Reprimands.

President Coleman publicly reprimanded young Paul Bower, of Spokane, this morning in the University chapel for what he termed disloyalty to his college. Indignities are being heaped thick and fast on the young student, who was thoughtless enough to win good Willamette money on the ball game.

The public reprimand from the president came close on the heels of an enforced apology from Bower to the football team.

It is said that the president told Bower that he had done very wrong, and then also reprimanded the hazing class, and said that he was president of the school, and, as such, he had the only authority for punishing pupils for "disloyalty."

Deltas Carry Revolvers

A number of the members of the White Winged Deltas went to college yesterday with pistols in their pockets, and one boy, bolder than the rest, had his gun in a belt and holster. It is said that this occasioned a scrap between him and a member of the bal team, and on the "frat's" refusal to discard his gun, he was seized and shaken until his teeth chattered.

Did Not Betray Signals.

It is admitted by students on the streets that young Bower did not betray his team by giving away the football signals. The students say that he was brutally hazed for other reasons. It is generally believed that the old regime had it in for him and the other members of the White Winged Deltas.
