RUGBY RULES REIGN.

Stanford and Berkeley Will Discard the Strenuous Type of Football.

Stanford University, Nov. 6.—Stanford and Berkeley will soon have their annual football game which will decide the question of supremacy between the two colleges, in this sport, another year. Instead of the American game, English Rugby will be played. It has taken hard and consistent work, by both the men and coach Lanagan, to master this game in the short time they have had. Oregon can be proud this year, as one of the men who represent her in this line of sport. At present, one of her men, out of the fifteen in the English game, are playing in all the practice games, and it looks as if they would all make places on the 'varsity team. Several others are also out and have been working hard the whole season. Last year five Oregon boys played in the varsity game. When one stops to consider that Oregon has only between thirty and forty men, out of an enrollment of one thousand or more, including the girls, it can be readily seen that she has more than her percentage of football players at this university, and every Oregon man has just grounds to be proud of the material which comes from that state.

The boys playing in the practice games are Koerner, Stott, Chalmers, Holman, and Fenton. Stott is captain of the 'varsity team this year, and is undoubtedly one of the best players in the west. Chalmers captained last year's 'varsity; Holman was captain of the '09 freshman, and Kenny Fenton led the '08 freshmen to victory. Kenny has always been handicapped on account of his weight, as he cannot tip the scales at one hundred and thirty, but what he lacks in that respect he makes up for in punting and head work and all the boys will be glad to see "the kid" make the team. "Dutch" Koerner, though not a captain, is always right where he is wanted during a game.

New Orleans, Nov. 6.—Jerry Johnson, an aged slave of the Day family of Baton Rouge, lost his life today as the result of a successful attempt to save the life of the 3 year old son of W. P. Day. 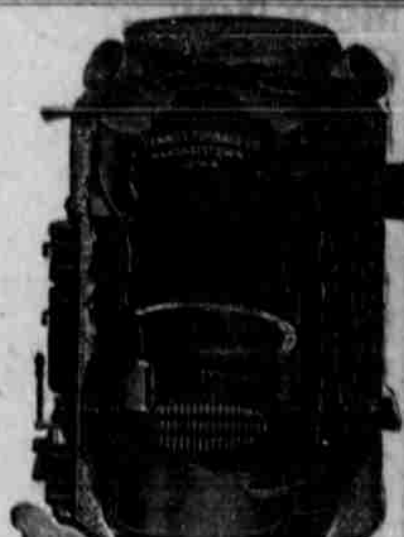
