CANNERY WILL CLOSE TOMORROW

Prominent Salem Institution Will Bring Successful Season to An End

The end of a successful season for the Salem Mutual cannery will be reached tomorrow evening.

For some time the cannery has been putting up apples exclusively and for the past week, the fruit has not been coming in fast enough to permit of the plant being run at its full capacity.

Although there is a considerable quantity of apples that will yet be brought to the institution, it has been thought best by the management to close the working department at the end of this week.

All apples that have been contracted for, and all others that are brought, for that matter will be received at the cannery and paid for at the full market price. The management will ship this to Portland where they will be canned. It is understood the Portland factory will be operated for some time yet.

The successful close of this season of the factory demonstrate that the enterprise has passed the experimental stage. It has been proven that canning fruit is a profitable industry in Marion county. While it is too early for the management to report to the stockholders what the profit and losses will be, it is known that canning Willamette valley fruit is a good business proposition.

With an intermission of only a week or so, the cannery has been running steadily ever since early in the summer. Nearly all the time it has been operated at its full capacity. Twice during the season, large additions to the buildings were made and still more room can be used.

It is now up to the farmers. If enough fruit can be procured the plant will be run at its full capacity all of next season. The cannery will begin operations on strawberries during the latter part of May and will run at full blast until in November.

The stockholders and the managers of the enterprise have great faith in the future of the canning business in this city. They believe that it is the coming great industry. The can forsee when thousands of acres of the rich Willamette valley lands that are now put to grass and wheat will be cup into small farms

and will be devoted to the growth of berries and small fruits.

This will treble and quadruple the population in the sections where it prevails.

Prices of berries and fruits will go up and employment will be given to hundreds of people at good paying pleasant work.

President Holcomb, Manager Kimball and Assistant Manager Fisher have worked hard this summer and fall to prove to the stockholders and the public that Salem is destined to become the center of one of the greatest canning sections in the country. It looks as if they had succeeded.
