Train Schedule.

Owing to the damaged bridge at Jefferson the early morning overland and the south bound night overland are sent by way of the west side.

The train schedule between Jefferson and Portland for the other trains is as usual, viz.

North bound local 8:30 a.m.
South bound local 10:38 a.m.
North bound local 4:49 p.m.
South bound local 6:32 p.m.

No trains run between Jefferson and Albany and those wishing to visit points south of Jefferson must either go to Portland and go by the way of the west side or go to Woodburn and transfer to the Silverton branch.

Those going to Woodburn on the north bound local may leave Woodburn at 10:50 a. m., and reach Albany about noon.

There is a train that leaves Woodburn in the evening making connections with the south bound local, thus a passenger bound for Eugene could take the 4:49 north bound and reach his destination about 9 p. m. by a transfer at Woodburn.

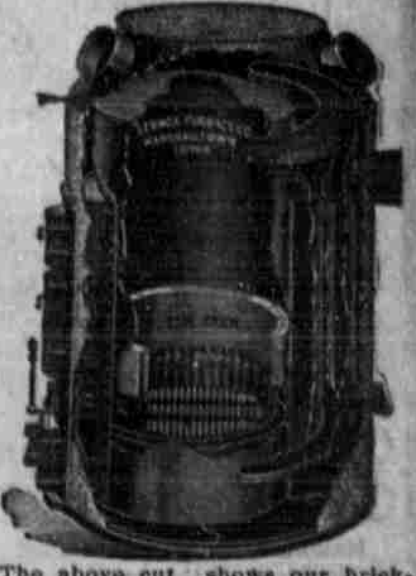
