WASHINGTON LEARNS OF ES-TABLISHMENT OF FLEET OF FOURTEEN VESSELS TO PLY HONOLULU AND AND NEW YORK AND SAN FRANCISCO AND NEW YORK, VIA THE ISTHMUS AF TEHAUN-TEPEC-FACT TAKEN PROOF THAT THE ERA OF WATER TRANSPORTATION HAS REALLY DAWNED.

Washington, Nov. 15 .- Word of what is regarded as the first important step taken in anticipation of the opening of the Panama canal, reached Washington this week from Mexico City. According to advices the American-Hawalian Steamship company will put in operation in January a fleet of fourteen big portant step taken in anticipation of lanuary a fleet of fourteen big freight steamers between New York and Honolulu, in connection with the Tehauntepee National railway of Mexico, which traverses the isthmus of Tehauntepee. It is believed that the steamships will run direct from coast to coast as soon as the Panama canal is opened, and that the company is starting thus early in orand San Francisco and New York der to establish its business.

The fleet of fourteen ships is to divided, seven of them plying between New York and Coatzacoalos, and an equal number between San Francissteamers will maintain a weekly schedule, and freight will be transshipped across the isthmus by rail.

The news is regarded here as most important to all sections of the country, for it goes to prove that an era of water transportation is at hand and the domination of the railroads in commerce thus is to be curbed naturally.
