CAME IN 1836.

B. Beers, of Independence, the Oldest Pioneer.

Mr. B. Beers, of Independence, falls the honor of being the pioneer now living in the state. Mr. Beers was the oldest present at the last pioneer's meeting, although at that time he was only a boy. He was born in 1836, but she has died. Mr. Beers was born November 5, 1825. In 1836 his father family started for Oregon by coming by Cape Horn, the trip lasting 140 days to the Sandwich Islands, and encountering many many perils. They remained on the islands three months, awaiting an opportunity to come on to this coast. He arrived here in 1837. The pioneer came as a farmer and blacksmith for the Methodist mission, located at that time ten miles below on the Willamette river, on which is known as the mission farm, where, the subject of this sketch, one of three children, attended the mission school with the Indian boys, and later attended the Salem schools. He was married May 1850 to Miss Eliza P. Smith, four children being born to them, two sons and two daughters. The daughters

are both dead, but the sons are living. His wife died in February 1878. Mr. Beers spent several years on the Yaquina river, and has since lived in different places, having spent the last two years in Independence. He enjoys good health, and his activity would be an inspiration to men 20 years his junior.—Polk County Itemizer.

Y., Nov. 23.—Upwards of 150 acres of land have been acquired by the Hebrew Sheltering Guardian society in Sherman park here on which it is intended to build a training college for poor children. The proposed school will cost \$1,000,000 and the subscriptions promised up to today are A. Lewisohn, \$50,000; the members of the family of the late Leonard Lewisohn, \$125,000, and Jacob H. Schniff, \$50,000.

Canadian Apple Crop Short.

Ottawa, Nov. 23.—The quantity of apples grown in Ontario and Nova Scotia this year is much less than appeared probable during the early summer months. Hot, dry weather in late summer, and early autumn months materially reduced the crop, the fruit having dropped badly and developed indifferently. As a result more or less of the fruit bought in the lump went into barrels in anything but a satisfactory condition, and the season as a whole has been disappointing. Barrels were expensive, labor scarce and high and the cost of picking and packing therefore was a heavy item. Autumn fruit of indifferent quality sold in Ontario as

low as 50 to 75 cents a barrel to growers, winter varieties on the tree at \$1.15 to \$1.25 with barreled stock largely \$1.50 to \$2.50 including the package. Some choice sorts have sold at \$2.50. The windfalls and trashy stuff eliminated, Ontario still has a considerable quantity of really choice fruit for winter markets in Canada and Europe. More or less damage has been done by the codling moth, but selected fruit, as a whole is clean and attractive.

Effect of Whiskey Upon Negro Labor

Jackson, Miss., Nov. 23.—In the county court house here today there was a full gathering of manufacturers and employers of labor for the purpose of discussing local labor conditions. The meeting was called by Messrs. W. B. Taylor, W. B. Gowdy and H. Clay Shauky, managers of large manufacturing plants. After considerable discussion it was decided to take steps to stop the illicit sale of liquor in the city, and other forms of criminality which were demoralizing to negro labor conditions. It was shown that there were hundreds of idle negroes in the city while the demand for laborers was so great manufacturing and other concerns were losing heavily for want of hands.

All national, state and local associations interested in the objects of the convention will be asked to send five delegates each and the governor of each state will be invited to appoint 10 delegates to the convention and furnish them with a credential. The convention will decide on the steps to be taken to promote the demand abroad for the products of farms, workshops and mines of America.

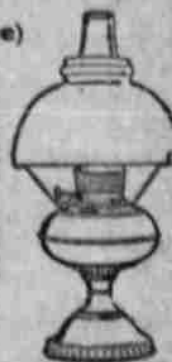
