Lists for Stationery, Drugs, Plumbing, Tinning, Leather and Findings, Mill Feed and Flour, Meats and Fish, Shoes, Crockery and Glassware will be furnished by the clerk upon application.

All goods must be in strict accordance with sample in original packages when possible, and delivered at the state insane asylum within 30 days after the contract is awarded, and bids must be on blank award, which will be furnished, together with the instructions to bidders, by the clerk upon application.

Each bid on flour or meat must be accompanied by a certified check of

\$300.00, and each bid on fish by a certified check of \$75.00, and all other bids by certified checks equal to 10 per cent of the amount bid; checks of unsuccessful bidders to be returned immediately, and those of accepted bidders when the contract is completed. Bids must be enclosed in sealed envelopes and directed to the board, care of the clerk, and plainly marked "Bids for Asylum Supplies," and the class of goods bid on should also be inscribed on the envelope. Price, fitness and quality being equal, preference will be given to articles manufactured, grown or produced in this state. When a particular article is specifically called for, bids on other kind, manufacture or brand, equally good will be entertained, but to insure recognition of such bids, samples of the articles it is proposed to supply must accompany them.

The board reserves the right to reject any or all bids, or to accept or reject any part of a bid. Bids will be opened at the capitol at Salem, at 10 a. m. Wednesday, December 19, 1906.

Norwegian Forests Stripped.

Ottawa, Dec. 7.—Reporting to the trade and commerce department today from Christiana Mr. E. G. Sontum, commercial agent, notes a serious condition in the Norwegian lumber and pulp trade owing to the high prices of logs. The facts seems to be that the Norwegian forests are not large enough to supply a sufficient quantity of logs for all existing mills, and that those branches of the wood goods trade which are not under existing conditions sufficiently profitable to stand the strain of the severe scramble for logs are doomed to go to the wall. It is stated on official authority that the forests of Norway, Sweden and Finland are not able to stand the drain to which they have been subjected in recent years.

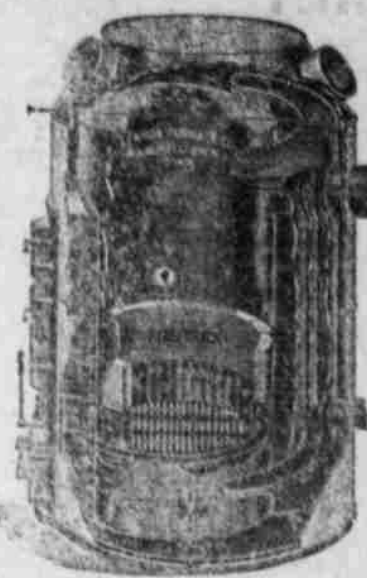
