home rule bill submitted by Sir Anthony McDowell was discussed at a large and representative meeting of Irishmen in the Rotunda tonight. Mr. John Redmond, M. P., presided. The new bill proposes to leave the legislative union untouched, and an Irish council is to be created with a proportion of between two-thirds and three-fourths of its members elected on the existing parliamentary frana restricted franchise or nominated at the same time; this country is to retain her present representation in the imperial parliament. Clergymen of all denominations are eligible for membership in the council. The new administration will be as follows: The central or castel board, a department of education, a department of agriculture, a department for land transfer. The police are to remain under imperial control, but are to be reduced in numbers, and the position of the judiciary is to remain unaffected. It is computed that after deduction from Irish tax revenue for imperial purposes \$25,000,000 a year will remain at the disposal of the Irish council. Mr. John Dillon, M. P., denounced the clauses under which the police are to remain under the direction of the imperial government, and Mr. Michael Flavin, M. P.; Mr. Haviland Burke, M. P.; Mr. S. Green, M. P., and others spoke against the formation of the central council or castle board. It is certain that when the bill is introduced in the house it will be productive of great heat, as the people of the north of Ireland and their parliamentary. representatives are wholly opposed to
