CLAIMS CHARGES UNTRUE

Special Committee Finds Adversely to Gesner Investigation Resolution

There "was nothing doing" when the special committee of the old council, appointed to investigate the Steusloff-Downing resolution asking an investigation of the alleged charges of fraud and graft on the part of the complaining aldermen, in connection with the letting of the contract and the construction of the reinforced concrete bridge on North Commercial street, made its report last evening before the candle was snuffed.

The report recommended that, after citing the results of its investigation, the resolution is not founded on truth, as to the statement of charges alleged to have been made, and the report was adopted unanimously. The report in full follows:

"The undersigned special committee, to whom was referred the resolution concerning the charges therein recited to have been made by Alderman Gesner against certain members of said council, beg to report as follows:

"We invited Alderman Gesner to appear before the committee and furnish facts to substantiate, or tending to substantiate, any of the said charges, or to direct us to any such facts. He appeared before the committee, but refused and failed to furnish any such facts. He stated, however, that some of the charges recited in said resolutions he did not make, and that some others recited he did not think that he made, but if he did make them he was willing to stand by them.

"Upon being asked to state any facts of which he had knowledge, or which would lead to facts, tending to substantiate that any member of said common council was guilty of corruption in office or graft in connection with any matters set forth in said resolution, he replied, in substance, that he would not, at this time, make any further statement.

"We deem it highly improper for any member of the council to make statements intimating or suggesting that any other member is guilty of graft or corruption in office, unless he is able and willing to produce the facts tending to substantiate the same.

"Having been unable to find any facts tending to substantiate any of the charges recited in the said resolutions, we herewith return the same with the finding that the same are not true.

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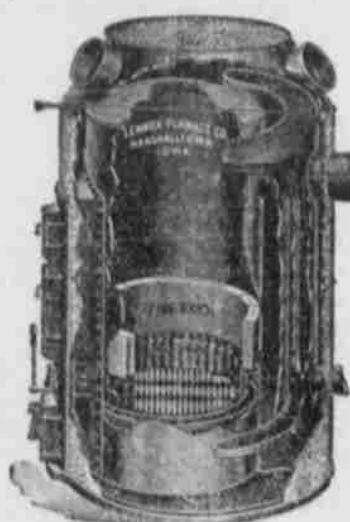
