ISH PLAY AT GRAND

Under the Auspices of St. Joseph's Society of This City

St. Joseph's society has secured for this city the great Irish play, written by Dion Bouccicault, and which has been played for half a century and whoever has seen Kerry once will want to see it again. We shall expect to see Father Anthony Moore out to see the drama of the native country presented by the talented young Irish actor, Mr. Doone.

Kerry Gow" is typically Irish. It tells of Dan O'Hara's love for pretty Nora Drew. He is a farrier, warm-hearted and honest. While he does not claim to be brilliant, he is gifted with wit and acumen which help Irishmen to high places in the world. The Drews are being pressed for a mortgage, which was gotten by a scoundrel, who has the presumption to declare his love to the innocent Nora. When he is refused, he leaves no stone unturned to crush the Drews and O'Hara. He uses henchmen to hide his tracks in the forge of the farrier, and makes out the story that O'Hara was taking those pikes for the rebels, that meant death in those days. O'Hara is arrested, but his innocence is proven after his escape. When in this plot, Hay intends foreclosing, but the younger Drew has a thoroughbred, which will sell for enough money to clear the debt, provided the horse wins. Hay secures the greatest racehorse of the day, and the contest is between the two animals. Drew's horse wins, the mortgage is paid and Nora and the farrier close the story with a kiss. After Hay and his henchmen are charged to jail for conspiracy.

The story itself is worth anyone's attention, but Mr. Doone has enriched the play with the sweetest touches of nature, and dressed all with truest bits of Irish scenery. The Drew farm is a delightful country picture, and the smithy offers every opportunity for naturalness, which opportunities are taken advantage of by the entire company. Mr. Doone and his helper make music on the anvil while beating red-hot iron into horseshoes, and the chatter and singing and dancing are so true to life that he forgets himself and believes that Mr. Doone has taken him into his own little shop. Then the race is made exciting by the fact that the horse is carried to the stage by carrier pigeons. "Kerry Gow" is natural, it is beautiful.
