STOCKMEN TO MEET IN SALEM

To Perfect Organization and Ask For Beneficial Legislation During Session

Tuesday, January 15th, a meeting of the Pure Bred Livestock Raisers' Association will be held in the council chamber of the city hall, in this city, for the purpose of perfecting permanent organization and transacting such other business pertinent to the objects for which the organization is formed, the promotion of interest in the breeding of standard, high-bred livestock by Oregon breeders, and the securing of such legal protection of the industry that is consistent without undue discrimination.

This association was organized temporarily during the last state fair, and embraces in its membership all of the thoroughbred livestock breeders in attendance upon the exposition at that time, all of the principal breeders in the state, Richard Scott, of the Twyford Stock Farm, of Milwaukie, is president, and N. C. Marie, of Portland, is secretary. The meeting will be called to order at 1 o'clock in the afternoon. It is also quite probable that some steps will be taken to secure some beneficial legislation during the approaching session of the legislature, and especially along the line of a reduction in freight rates for shipping.

Deputy Clerk A. S. Benson, of the supreme court, who is also secretary of the Salem Elks' lodge, has just passed through an experience that was a complete surprise to him. For a long time the lodge committee worked hard to induce the management of the local electric light company to remove an unsightly post, formerly used to support the trolley wire, from in front of the new temple on Liberty street, in order that an unobstructed view of the building could be secured in a picture to decorate the invitations that are being prepared for the formal dedication of the new corral.

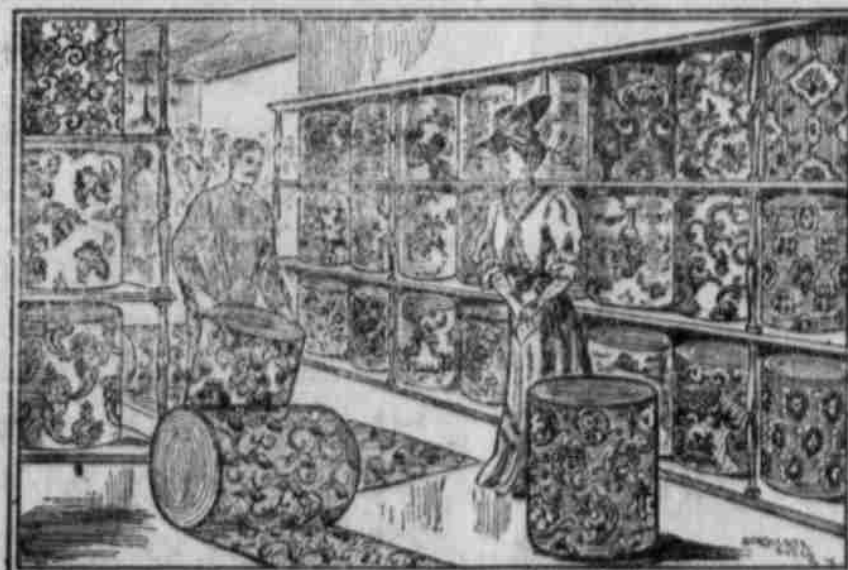
