**ROSEBURG METHODIST CHURCH**

**Brief Words in Regard to its Early History and Founders**

Roseburg Spokesman: The Umpqua mission of the Methodist church was organized in 1852 and embraced all of the state of Oregon south of the Calapooia mountains and took in Scottsburg and Coos Bay. Rev. J. H. Wilbur was the presiding elder and Rev. J. O. Payner was the preacher in charge.

In 1853 the South Umpqua circuit was separated from the Umpqua mission and Rev. J. W. Miller was appointed pastor. The first quarterly conference was held on South Deer creek, at the home of James Gilmore, and there were present, besides the pastor, Rev. J. H. Wilbur, the presiding elder, L. M. Pearce, James Gilmore, Adam Day, John Aiken, Samuel Casebeer and W. W. Judd. Rev. J. W. Miller served the church for two years and was succeeded by Rev. J. O. Payner, and he in turn by Rev. J. M. Anderson.

In 1859 Rev. C. G. Belknap was appointed the pastor and it was at this time that the charge was changed from the south Umpqua circuit to the Roseburg circuit. In this same year the old part of the church now being used was built. One of those who assisted largely in the building of the same was Mr. A. R. Lint, who has long since passed to his reward.

During its existence, the church has had as pastors some of those, who have, in after years, become great men in the church and who have done much to mould the destinies of the whole Oregon country, such as Rev. C. C. Straiton, Rev. A. C. Fairchild, Rev. T. J. Wolfe, Rev. T. A. Wood, Rev. J. H. Skidmore and Rev. F. D. Winton. Both Wood and Winton since left the ministry for the practice of law, the former becoming a celebrated lawyer of Portland and the latter being now enjoying a lucrative practice and being a highly esteemed citizen of Astoria. Probably the most successful revival ever held in the church was held during the pastorate of Rev. J. L. Startford in 1890-91, conducted by Mrs. Barrett, when there were added some 50 to 60 new converts.

The present building was erected or rather enlarged about ten years ago and it was thought it would suffice for a quarter of a century, but the rapid strides of the church in keeping pace with the advancement of the country has made the present quarters inadequate for the demands of the hour. A plan has been formed for the erection of a fine stone or brick building at a cost of some \$8000 or \$10,000, the same to be equipped with all the modern conveniences called for in such places.
