MADE FUN OF THE BILL

Wallace McCamant opened the ball in the senate chamber last night in discussion of railroad commission legislation for the smaller railroads—the Hillsboro and Tillamook lines. He said there were important problems that required the attention of the legislature. Oregon needed the little railroads. The people demanded relief from car shortage, but did not want to be anarchists and do injustice. The laws made must be sane and just. Legislation that might bankrupt the little railroads should not be adopted. Car shortage but do not cripple the little roads. He favored the Johnson bill for reciprocal demurrage. It required the shipper to put up 25 per cent of the freight on any order for cars. This was a provision that would protect the roads against the hot air holder artist who had it in for the railroads. Another feature was the right of a short railroad to demand empty cars when it delivered loaded cars to a longer road. The penalties of the Teal bill next engaged the attention of Mr. McCamant. They were the same for the smallest railroad as for the largest. He was surprised to learn from Messrs. Teal and Muir that they expected this act to apply to interstate traffic. He thought the little railroads of Oregon could all be sold for old junk if this law was enacted. While Mr. McCamant was hurling his eloquent perorations against

the bill it was easy to see that some of the senators had made up their minds to vote for the bill as they read. The Capital Journal during his whole speech. Except the anti-pass feature, there was no demand for this law. Mr. Lytle said it would bankrupt him. It would stop all construction of small railroads that were so sadly needed in Oregon.

Clyde Fulton appeared for the Astoria & Columbia River Railroad company. That road's managers had come to the conclusion that the legislators were as much interested in the welfare of the state and its railroads as the capitalists whose money was invested. Mr. Fulton was not sanguine about allowing the governor to appoint and remove men at will. The general features of the bill were not acceptable to Mr. Fulton and he was able to make quite a showing to that effect.

Like Mr. McCamant he made game of some of the minor features—spent a goodly time picking pin feathers out of the railroad commission bill's carcass. Mr. Fulton grew quite facetious at the expense of the framers of the bill. He thought the whole thing had a forked tail and horns on its head and ought to be torn to pieces and made a bonfire of.

Samuel Connell, a large lumberman, of Portland, made a strong argument for the commission bill, and showed the losses suffered by himself and other dealers for lack of cars.

W. W. Cotton, for the Harriman system, reviewed the objections to the bill in a scathing and sarcastic manner, that left little to be said in its favor. But Joe Teal, attorney for the transportation committee of the Chamber of Commerce, closed the debate with just as scathing and sarcastic an arraignment of the conditions which the bill was aimed to re-

move. Teal and Cotton have been pitted against each other at Spokane, before the Washington legislature and on many a battlefield, and both are experts. This concluded the debating, and Chairman Coffey, of the house, adjourned the hearings.

BIG METEOR FELL.

A few days ago a big meteor fell on the farm of a German living near the Gelsendorfer farm in Linn county, striking the Dutchman's barn and sinking into the earth 12 feet. The hole made is fifteen feet in diameter and the indications are the meteoric stone is that size.

If this is the true size of the meteoric it is by far the largest one in existence.

Previous to this find the largest meteoric was found in Australia and was something like ten feet in diameter.

The second largest meteor was discovered in Clackamas county three years ago by Ellis Hughes on the land of the Iron & Steel company of Oregon, and is some eight feet in diameter and very irregular in shape. After a year's litigation on the subject the Iron & Steel company took the meteor to the Lewis and Clark fair on a flat boat and afterwards donated it to the Smithsonian institution. Its value is said to be \$10,000 and it was composed almost wholly of malleable iron with a trace of cobalt and nickel.

Until the Linn county find is examined its composition and value are of course unknown.

Reply to Property Owner.

Editor Journal:—In your issue of yesterday you published a statement from a citizen which seems to be a boost for asphalt pavement, and while that kind of street pavement may be all right in some places, it is not the thing for this wet climate, and furthermore the gentleman quoted either wilfully or ignorantly states things that are far from facts. He speaks of Portland using asphalt pavement, which is not true, for there has not been a foot of asphalt paving been put down in Portland in over five years, whereas there have been miles of bitulithic pavement put down in that city during that time.

Your informant also speaks of other kinds of pavement being torn up and substituted with asphalt. This again is not the case. On Pacific avenue in Tacoma many blocks of asphalt have been torn up and bitulithic put down in its stead. In no city in the United States has bitulithic pavement ever been torn up and followed by any other kind of pavement, but in New York City on Walnut street in front of the Briealin hotel, so-called bituminous macadam was torn up to make place for better pavement. Bituminous macadam is not bitulithic, but the substitute for bitulithic put down by the Barber asphalt people.

Now these are hard facts, and The Journal should give them place to correct the impression created by the erroneous statements made in its columns by "Property Owner," who while appearing to be a fair-minded man seems to be strongly prejudiced in favor of what is the real interest of the Barber Asphalt company.
