IRIGATION CODE IS IN A BAD BOX

Organized and Determined Fight Waged Against It

That a united if not carefully organized fight is being made to defeat the proposed irrigation code, as proposed by the special commission of the Portland board of trade, is evidenced by the strenuous session of the joint committee on irrigation held last evening in the state house when no less than a half-dozen persons, either directly or indirectly interested in private or corporate irrigation and water power projects, appeared and endeavored to influence the committee that the passage of the code would mean ruin to the irrigation and water interests of the state and disorganize the whole system generally.

The principal antagonists to the code last evening were those from Oregon, including Dr. C. L. who owns immense water power properties on the Rogue river, Judge L. R. Webster, of Multnomah, who also appeared before the committee and, although he disagreed with anything but a private interest in the matter, it is stated that he is the legal representative of one of the principal private irrigationists in Oregon and is himself personally interested in the Carey reclamation project near Burns. The committee took a recess until this afternoon when Attorney Will R. Burns, of the best irrigation authorities in the board.

WALKED INTO TRAIN.

Stranger Deliberately Commits Suicide at Clackamas Station Yesterday.

Oregon City, Feb. 6.—The north-bound train, which passed Oregon City about 1:20 Tuesday afternoon, ran over a man about one-half mile this side of Clackamas Station about 2 o'clock. Word was sent to the agent of the Southern Pacific of this city, who notified Coroner Holman.

The man was a stranger. He was observed to have been walking up and down the track all day. He walked right into the train, and it is thought he deliberately committed suicide.

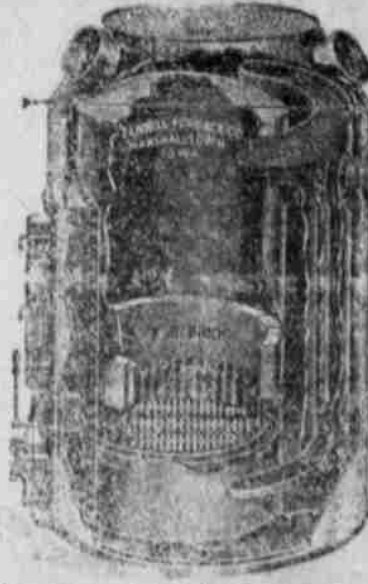
