Report on Soldiers' Home.

The special house committee, composed of C. S. Jackson, Gilbert L. King and B. F. Pike, to investigate the soldiers' home submitted a written report today stating that the management of the home had been properly conducted and the buildings and grounds kept in good condition and inmates satisfied.

The committee recommends the buildings be painted; fire escapes from the main barracks be protected by banisters and platforms; construction of a morgue and assembly hall separate from the main barracks the latter to have rooms on the second floor for female attendants.

For the construction of a morgue the committee recommended the appropriation of \$1000; for assembly hall, \$3500; painting buildings, etc., \$3000; support and maintenance and additional \$8000, and that the salary of the commandant be increased to \$1000 per annum and that of the adjutant to \$750, and for furnishing rations and fuel to soldiers living in cottages. They find that Commandant Elder has given the state a very economical administration.

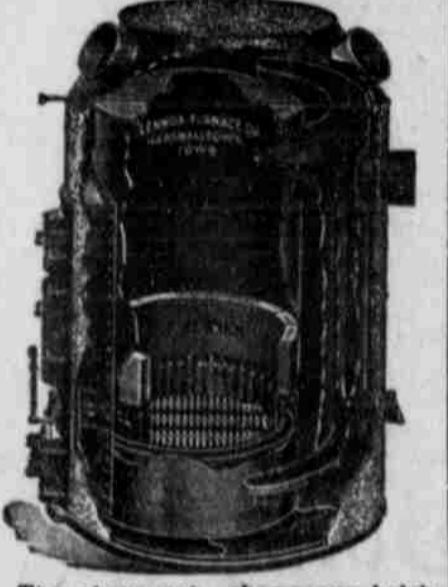
