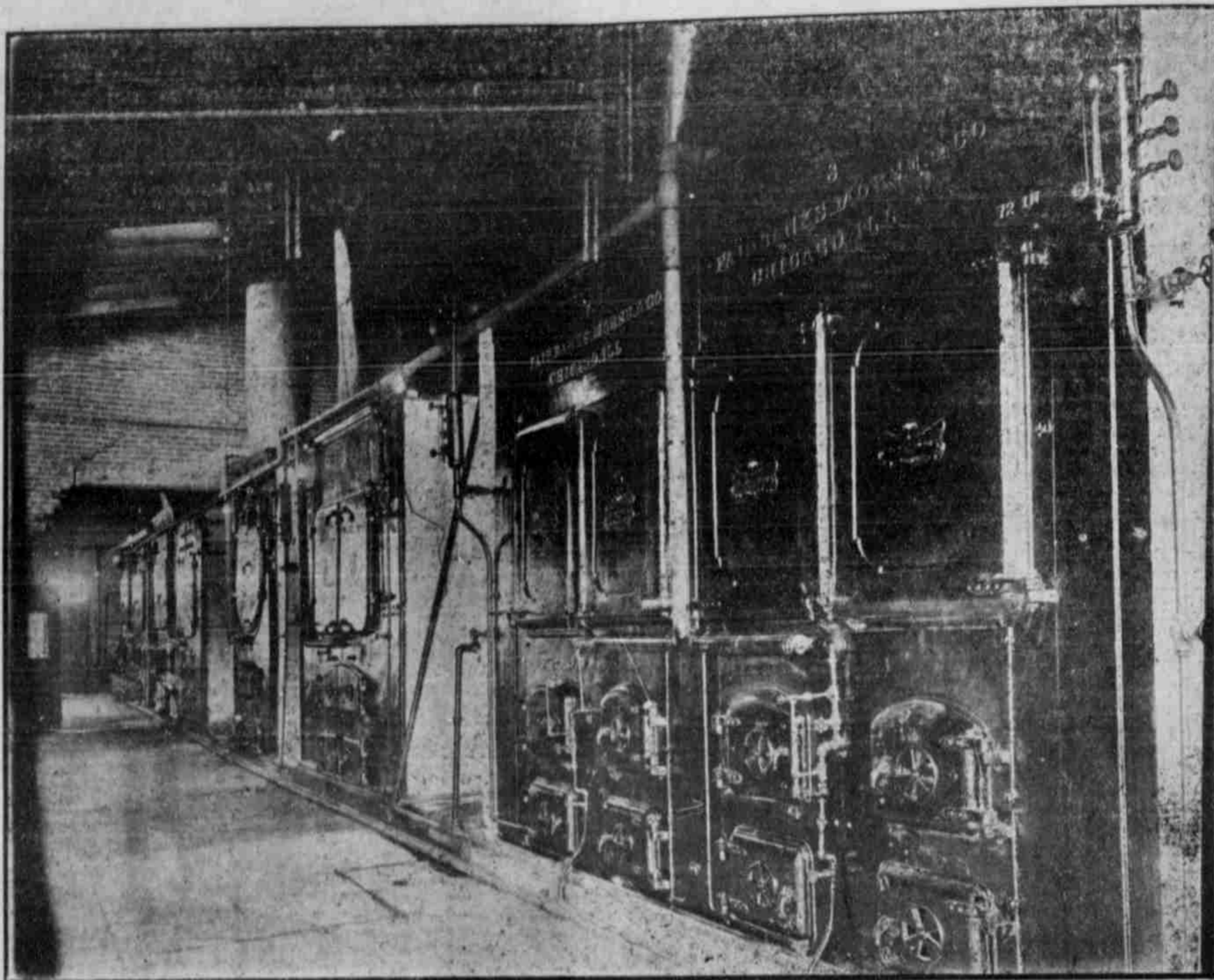

WORK OF REVISING JOURNALS

Preparation of Laws for Publication Left to Speaker Davey

The work of preparing the journals of the senate proceedings has been entrusted to Chief Clerk Frank S. Grant and Calendar Clerk Frank K. Lovell, and the time limited to 24 days.

The work in the house is under the direction of Representative Brown, of Linn county, and the work is being done by Chief Clerk W. Lair Thompson, Assistant Clerk Drager and Calendar Clerk Barry, time limited to twenty days.

Speaker Frank Davey has been appointed by Secretary of State Frank Benson to prepare the laws for publication as fast as they are filed by the governor. He will also have charge of preparing the copy for the house and senate journals for the printer. He began work this morning with a sufficient force of clerks.

This work has been done in the past by A. O. Condit, of this city. The appointment of Mr. Davey will meet with general satisfaction.
