## 10 DAYS FAIR

Twenty Thousand Dollars for New Stock Barns—Grounds to be Improved—Prize List Revised.

At the request of the stockmen of Northwest it has been officially decided to have a six days' fair for the year 1917. Many counties have expressed their intention to have a display, and a good live fair to be assured. Multnomah county has officially announced its appropriation of \$1000 for a display. Columbia, Benton, Marion and Jackson counties have officially announced that they will be represented.

Twenty thousand dollars have been appropriated with which, to build new stock sheds, and the buildings will be constructed on modern plans, and the details for convenience, cleanliness and exhibit advantage will be carefully looked after. The buildings will be labeled, showing the breeds of stock it contains, and the lighting will be such as to show the exhibits to an advantage at all times. The state lighting bill which was recently passed by the legislature, includes the state fair grounds, and will enable the management to have the lighting in general, which will add much to the attractiveness and convenience of the exhibits and grounds.

The management will endeavor to have a year to make a start to beautiful grounds with shrubs, flowers and additional walks, and will strive to fill all vacant space with good attractions and accommodations for the patrons.

"Resolved, That the president of this society be requested to appoint a committee of three to confer with the State Board of Agriculture, with a view to the establishment of a closer relationship between that board and this society, to the end that a better horticultural display may be provided at our state fair."

### Two Battleships Ready.

Norfolk, Feb. 27.—The sixteen-thousand tons battleship Minnesota built by the Newport News Shipbuilding company is complete, excepting the matter of ordnance equipment, and will be handed over to the government officials this afternoon. She is in the navy yard here but it has not yet been decided where she will ship her ordnance.

Quincy, Mass., Feb. 27.—The Fore River Shipbuilding company has handed the battleship Vermont, a sister ship to the Minnesota, over to the navy department. She is fully equipped with the exception of her armament.

### Tuberculosis Exhibition.

Portland, Me., Feb. 27.—What is called a "tuberculosis exhibition," opened here today at which are exhibits showing the causes of the disease, methods to be adopted to prevent it and its different kinds of cures. A number of physicians have volunteered their services to guide visitors about and explain the exhibits to them. At 4 o'clock each afternoon which the exhibition remains open there will be a lecture on tuberculosis, illustrated by stereopticon views, by some of the leading physicians in the state. The principal lecture will be given by Dr. Vincent P. Bowditch, of Boston, who was the first medical man to demonstrate that tuberculosis can be cured at home. His father endowed the senatorium at Sharon and they have carried on for seventeen years. The exhibition is being held under the auspices of the National Society for the Prevention of Tuberculosis.
