Metal Company Changes Hands.

Chicago, Feb. 28.—The National Lead company has taken over control of the Magnus Metal company, a leading producer of composition metal in this country. The Magnus company has plants in Chicago, St. Louis, Topeka, Jersey City, Newark and New Haven. It is capitalized at \$1,500,000, 8 per cent preferred stock, and \$1,500,000 common stock, on which it pays dividends of 10 per cent. It has also a large surplus largely invested in plant construc-

GRANGE MAY INVOKE THE REFERENDUM

Bulletin Issued Suggests Organized Action and Urges Compulsory Referendum

The work of the legislative session just closed seems likely to turn public attention, with new interest, toward direct legislation.

The proceedings at this session must convince the people generally, that their affairs should not be left too largely in the hands of their so-called representatives, no matter by what method they may have been nominated.

The initiative and referendum were introduced to bring public officers more completely under popular control. The Grange has shown what can be done with the initiative in taxing corporations, when the legislature fails to do so. But the referendum lies apparently dead, useless and forgotten. We have not seen a single reference to the referendum during the session. It would never be guessed from the conduct of the legislature, nor the newspaper comments and criticisms thereon, that any such thing as the referendum existed in Oregon!

The legislature itself seems to have forgotten that the people have or should have any control over their acts.

But, vicious though legislative measures may be, they are very likely to escape an appeal to the people, unless there be some organization to take some such measure up and get them referred.

It takes organization and some money to invoke the referendum; and this organization the great body of the people do not possess. For this reason the optional referendum as we possess it, has serious defects.

Now the Grange has the funds to print the referendum petitions, and the organization to circulate them widely, and it can do nothing more effectual to increase its influence and membership among farmers, than by showing them the power it thus possesses.

Further, it might be well for the people to turn their attention to the advisability of making the referendum compulsory, in certain classes of cases. It is now altogether optional with the legislature to refer measures to the people, and this option has not yet strongly enough been exercised in a single instance. —Oregon State Grange Bulletin.

Armstrong Exercises Strong Arm.

County Fruit Inspector E. C. Armstrong has inaugurated his annual campaign against scale and other fruit tree pests and has already begun to make his operations and influence felt to the extent of condemning and cutting down a great number of trees which were infested and which the owners refused to spray after several warning notices. Mr. Armstrong is determined to wage a relentless warfare against infested orchards this year and will show no mercy. He declines to give the names of the persons owning the trees already destroyed, preferring to save the humiliation of publicity any says there has not been a single instance as yet of a threat of litigation to restrain him from exercising the full powers of his office.
