VELOUS FEATS OF IDIOTS

Minded Children Perform
Mental Computations and Are
Walking Dictionaries.

Salem, March 1.—The Iowa state institution for feeble minded children located at Glenwood, has several "idiot savants," who are regarded as remarkable. One inmate is a calendar and date record, another is utilized as a dictionary, and others show the marks of unexplainable traits of "learned idiots."

A. R. Chier, assistant superintendent of the institution, has just made a report, as required by the law. The most astonishing reports are that of John S., who entered the institution when he was 12 years of age and who has there 23 years. He is the menial bookkeeper of the home.

When the date of any occurrence at the institution is desired, John S. gives it. He recites without error the date of the payment of any new hand or the date of discharge of any inmate.

He has seen a visitor at the institution and he can recall the exact date of the visit, the condition of the weather at that time and some of the incidents connected therewith, even when it occurred years before any question is asked him concerning it.

When the day of the month, the month of the year or any occurrence far back as 35 years John S. will, without hesitation, tell upon what day of the week the date fell. Asked if he does it he replies that he does not know.

His marvelous ability is shown by a inmate about 16 years of age.

He can neither read or write, yet he can readily spell any word given him, and as Dr. Schier says: "He has been tried with uncommon words time and time again and never fails to spell them correctly. He is constantly called upon to settle spelling disputes, and is as reliable as a dictionary." Both his parents were insane.

G. F. H., aged 18, of Danish descent, can multiply three figures by three figures as rapidly as they can be written down. He never fails in his multiplication feats, but his addition, subtraction and division are not correct.

A 17 year old boy, R. G. L., without education, is able to mould the forms of animals with almost miraculous perfection. Other figures he cannot make. He has found one day mixing saliva with dust and moulding the figures of animals, which from his first attempt were perfect in almost every detail.

ACQUITTED OF MURDER.

Lucy Allen Freed from Charge of Killing Henry Carrow of Lewiston.

Within a few minutes after the case had been submitted to them for decision, the jury in the district court yesterday afternoon returned a verdict of not guilty in the case of Lucy Allen, charged with murder by stabbing. The arguments of the attorneys were reviewed in detail by County Attorney Needham for the state and by Attorneys Clay McNamee and J. L. Harn for the defense. The attorneys for the defense had handled the case throughout with ability and in the arguments to the jury took the position that it had not been proven Lucy Allen killed Henry Carrow, but that instead the evidence went more directly to show that the wound which caused Carrow's death was probably inflicted by Smith L. George. All the parties concerned being Indians.—Lewiston Tribune.

Glass Factory Shut Down.

Pittsburg, March 1.—Nearly all the hand-made window glass factories are now closed down. While the time for closing all factories for the summer is, according to agreement, June 30 a number closed three ago and only a few fires now remain working in the glass trade. This is taken as evidence that the window glass market is in as poor shape as ever it was in the history of the industry. It has transpired that representatives of practically all the handmaking factories, outside the trust, agreed upon a wholesale curtailment in production. Innumerable employes who expected steady work until late in June have been laid off until next September when the fires will be started again. It is stated that the market is overstocked and that some curtailment is necessary if present selling prices are to be maintained.
