not well framed. It gave the companies a chance to retaliate. The inequity of the ordinance was that it did not deal with the matter in a fair and equitable manner.

Mr. Low said insurance was very high. He paid as high as \$45 per \$1000. Rates were so high now they could not raise them. They had not paid enough to help support the fire department. They do not pay enough for the privilege of doing business here.

Mayor Rodgers: "I agree with you there, Mr. Low."

Mr. Frazer said they had told him at Portland that they would not reduce rates if a better fire department was put in.

The mayor closed the debate by saying that he was moved to veto the ordinance because the flat rate of \$50 was unjust to surety, plate glass and accident companies. Insurance risks were based in part on the license fee and it would certainly raise rates.

Mr. Jacobs said he was not qualified fully to vote and asked to be excused. Members objected. On roll call he explained his vote, by saying he favored a graduate tax on insurance companies. He voted aye finally.

Four noes and nine ayes resulted in sustaining the ordinance. The noes were Downing, Churchill, Stolz, Greenbaum, Waldo. The rest voted aye.

The resolution providing for a charter commission was adopted.

A petition asking that present auctioneers license be not repealed. Ordinance to issue \$2142.43 South Commercial street bonds was passed. Bayne moved to indefinitely postpone ordinance on auctioneers. Lost Resolution by Stolz directing city attorney to prepare ordinances and charter for publication. Carried.

A resolution authorizing purchase of three teams and wagons to do city work was ruled out of order.

After hearing a number of communications and requests and petitions to open Pine street, asking bids for a road grader, the council adjourned.

Gould Road Opens.

Wellington, O., March 5.—The Lorain and West Virginia railroad the new Gould line between here and Lorain giving the Wabash four lake ports for handling the immense traffic between Pittsburg and the lakes, opened today for traffic. This line is probably the most important link connecting the Wabash railroad and the lakes and means much to Pittsburg shippers. A syndicate was organized to build the road, which will be turned over to the Wabash today. The line is 35 miles long, and has been built at an enormous cost owing to the large amount of grading and heavy bridges. It is a single track line chiefly for the handling of coal and ore between the lakes and the manufacturing concerns in the Pittsburg district. Passenger service will eventually be established which will become an important factor in the handling of traffic in and out of the Pittsburg district.
