The morning of January 8 experienced the coldest temperature since the founding of the Manila observatory in 1865, the mercury registering | lion one-half ounce, Compound Karat 5 o'clock in the morning. In the open air at the same time the thermometer stood at 56.8 degrees, five feet above the ground, and 55.6 degress, one foot above the ground.

The lowest temperature ever registered prior to this, and since the foundation of the observatory, was 59.7 and 60.6 degrees, which was reached December 19 and 20, 1872. and December 10 and 11, 1879. In January, 1881, December, 1892, and February, 1902, the minimum temperature reached was 59.7 and 60 degrees Farenheit.

The cold wave was not confined to Manila but reached through the provinces to the north, several places, not in the mountains, reporting temperatures around 50 degrees. At Bagino, the summer capital in the mountains of Benguet, it was two degrees below freezing and ice was formed. All this cold was experienced between 14 and 17 degrees north latitude, which is hardly the weather looked for in lands so near the equator.
