tive to the Philippine exhibit for this exposition. After wards he had an interview with the officials of the exposition and made them a proposition for an exhibit that would be true to life and still show the difference between the civilized and uncivilized peoples of the archipelago. There is an idea prevalent among people at home who have seen the Philippine exhibit of Moros and Igorots at previous fairs that the whole of the islands are inhabited by that class of people.

The most prominent idea of the coming exhibit is to correct this erroneous impression that folks at home have of the Philippines, and at the same time make a display that will accurately represent the Filipino people as a whole. To this end a mammoth exhibit is being prepared of articles illustrating the arts, life and industries of the Filipinos, and, in addition to the Moros and Igorots representing the uncivilized tribes; there will be a complete representation of Visayans, Tagalogs and Iloca-

nos who furnish the best types of the civilized races.
The Jamestown exposition is to have a Philippine reservation consisting of one enclosure, with one admission fee so that every visitor will necessarily see the great contrast presented by the two elements here in the Philippines. Among the civilized people will be musicians, wood-carvers, weavers of the beautiful textiles of country, and other workers who will truly represent all phases of the leading industries of the civilized people.

The morning of January 8 experienced the coldest temperature since the founding of the Manila observatory in 1865, the mercury registering 59 degrees Fahrenheit, under shelter, at 5 o'clock in the morning. In the open air at the same time the thermometer stood at 56.8 degrees, five feet above the ground, and 55.6 degrees, one foot above the ground.

The lowest temperature ever registered prior to this, and since the foundation of the observatory, was 59.7 and 60.6 degrees, which was reached December 19 and 20, 1872, and December 10 and 11, 1879. In January, 1881, December, 1892, and February, 1902, the minimum temperature reached was 59.7 and 60 degrees Fahrenheit.

The cold wave was not confined to Manila but reached through the provinces to the north, several places, not in the mountains, reporting temperatures around 50 degrees. At Baguio, the summer capital in the mountains of Benguet, it was two degrees below freezing and ice was formed. All this cold was experienced between 14 and 17 degrees north latitude, which is hardly the weather looked for in lands so near the equator.
