PLAN TO FINANCE NORMAL.

Banks Offer to Advance Money to

Regents.

The maintenance of the Monmouth State Normal School has reverted to the shoulders of the board of regents. Under the provision made by them Monday, at their meeting here. a regular statement of the contingent expenses, as well as the payrolls, will be filed with the Secretary of State, as heretofore, and several banks have agreed to advance the money on them, requiring an assignment of the payrolls over to them. The members of the board will individually stand responsible for the payment of the hypothecated securities. This was practically the only course they could follow, as there are no funds available by the state, and Governor Chamberlain could not take any steps towards securing assistance, even if he were so disposed.
