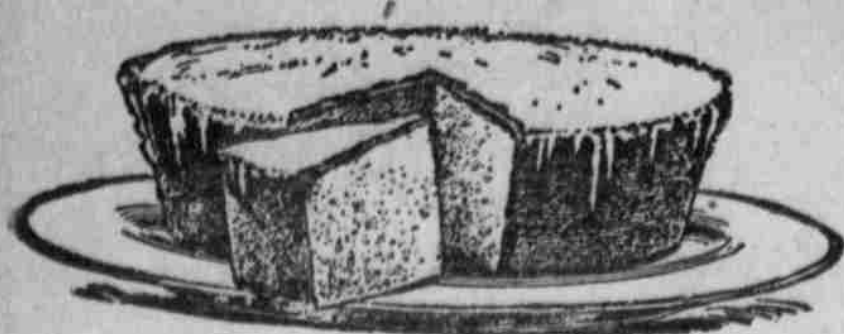

Record Breaker for Northern Mexico.

Chihuahua, Mex., April 3.—S. D. Bridge, of the City of Mexico, who has returned from Parral, Chihuahua, is enthusiastically optimistic over the condition there and the bright prospects of its becoming the biggest milling proposition in northern Mexico.

"Speaking of the camp, he says: 'It will only be a short time before the mills there will be treating 1000 tons of ore per day. A 300 ton plant is being put in by the Parral Power & Milling company, but this will undoubtedly be increased in capacity rapidly. Large cyanide plants will also be installed for the saving of the low grade values in silver and gold ores, of which there is almost unlimited quantity.'"

FOUR NEW COMPANIES, HOSPITAL CORPS AND AMBULANCE BRIGADE TO BE ORGANIZED IN THIS STATE

(Lester Davis Special in Portland Telegram from Salem.)

The state military board this afternoon will make provision for the organization of a full hospital corps and ambulance brigade, with complement of about 50 officers and men, and for an additional battalion of infantry to complete the organization of the Fourth regiment.

On account of strife between the officers and men of Company L, of La Grande, which practically disorganized the company, orders have been issued disbanding that organization and a new company is being formed at Pendleton to replace it. The officers of the disbanded company are Captain A. B. Rogers, First

Lieutenant Goodrich and Second Lieutenant Williams.

Three of the four companies to compose the new battalion of the Fourth regiment will be organized at McMinnville, Cottage Grove and Oregon City. The fourth company is still in doubt, but the choice of location lies between Silverton and Tillamook. This will give the fourth regiment two battalions and will place it practically upon the basis of a full regiment, and will necessitate a full staff of regimental officers from Colonel down. Major Yoran, of the First Separate battalion, of Eugene, will probably be raised to the rank of colonel of the new regiment, but the personnel of the balance of the staff, lieutenant colonel, two majors, etc., has not been decided upon.

Alderman Radcliff an Innocent Man.

Alderman Radcliff was the hottest man in town this morning when he awoke to the fact that the new dog ordinance, introduced at the last session of the council, had been surreptitiously laid at his door. He is neither the legal or illegal or otherwise parent of the unknown child, and the effort of the morning paper to make him father it is the joke of the season. Radcliff says he will take all the abuse in the world for advocating revenue ordinances, or street improvement ordinances, but he was raised in Kansas, and his political training was not neglected to such an extent that he will look up trouble over dog ordinances or chicken ordinances, or cat ordinances, or any other trouble-breeding and unprofitable kind of legislation. He wants it distinctly understood that whoever put up that job on him has one coming the first time he meets him. He is opposed to all such legislation, and while he does not keep a dog, it is not because he is not a friend of dogs, but because he has never found one to just suit him.

To Collect Note.

Oscar W. T. Mueller vs. The German Evangelical Reformed Bethany church of Salem and August Schnuelle, Jacob Denny, Hans Tuffli and Wm. Wulfmeyer, trustees, is the title of a suit filed in department No. 2 of circuit court to collect certain notes which are set forth in the complaint as having been made for valuable consideration by the defendants to the plaintiff. The plaintiff asks for a judgment against the defendant for \$2000, with interest at 8 per cent from the 21st day of November, 1904, also \$250 for attorney's fees. The notes are secured by mortgages on certain property which the court is petitioned to sell and apply the proceeds to the payment of said note.
