

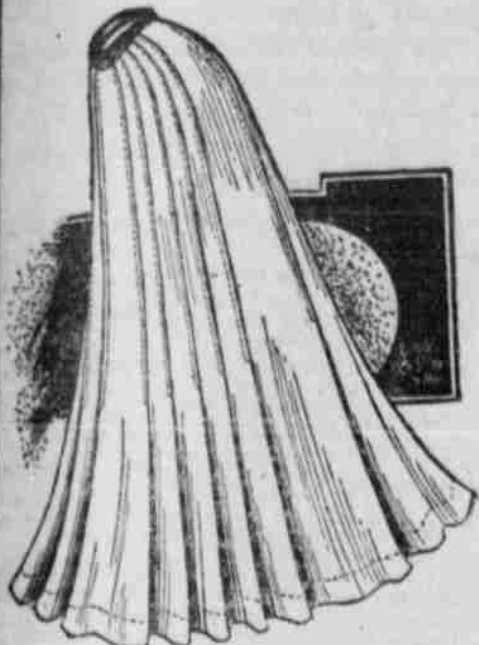

Roseburg Water and Light Plants.

Roseburg, April 10.—"We are in the water and light business to stay, and propose to give this city an adequate service. If the system now in operation, with the assistance of the new pump we expect soon to install, will not meet the demands made upon it, we shall put in a plant that will. The existing mains of less than four inches in diameter will be replaced at once, and several thousand feet of new mains also laid. The new pump will have a capacity of 1,250,000 gallons daily—enough to supply a town of twice the size of Roseburg."

This is the substance of the statement made by Mr. J. L. Kendall, who, with his brother, S. A. Kendall, own the Roseburg water and light system. Mr. Kendall arrived in this city Thursday from Pittsburg, where the firm of Kendall Bros. is heavily interested. The gentleman is here looking after the needs and requirements of Roseburg in the matter of water and light, as well as examining into their extensive lumber interests in this county. Mr. Kendall is accompanied by Messrs J. Gibson and Hugh McIlvain, of Philadelphia, retail lumber merchants of that city—in fact the McIlvain business is the largest of its kind in the Quaker City, and has been established for more than a century.
