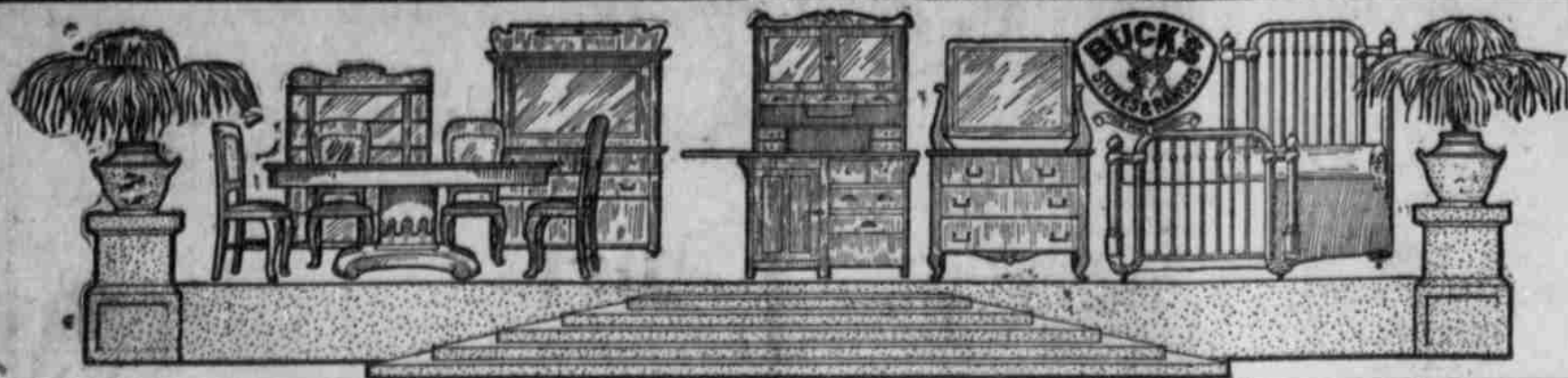

### THE REFERENDUM.

### National Arbitration Peace Congress.

New York, April 15.—The announcement of the program of the National Arbitration Peace congress in this city, for the three days beginning today, indicates a series of meetings that ought to stir powerfully the peace sentiment of the country.

That such a congress may be especially needed at this time is evident to those who have followed the preparations and discussions preliminary to the next international conference at the Hague. It is proving to be very difficult to bring that assemblage questions which strike at the roots of war; and not even the British premier's proposal for the limitation of armaments seems to obtain much of any backing aside from our own government.

The New York call for the peace cause, therefore, must be considered timely, for it will doubtless echo and re-echo with that strong saying of the late Secretary Hay, that "War is the most futile and ferocious of human follies."

At the opening of the session Mr. Carnegie will preside, and, after speeches by Mayor McClellan and Governor Hughes, Secretary Elihu Root will deliver the chief address of the day. This should be a notable utterance.

On the third day there will be an exceptional list of speakers, led by William J. Bryan, Judge George Gray, and Congressman Bartholdi. Many Europeans active in the peace cause will attend the meetings, which will be held in Carnegie hall.

The press committee contains a representative from every paper published in New York, whether daily, weekly or monthly, which has a general circulation, and in addition to this a representative of the Associated Press, The American Press Association, Hearst News Service, and Reuter's. Invitations have been issued to the editor of every important paper published in the United States. The committee will also supply to the papers—monthly and weekly as well as daily—material in regard to this congress, given out so as to reach the entire country. After this congress is over, it is believed no part of the United States will be in ignorance about the interparliamentary plan for establishing peace on a permanent foundation of justice.

### Lands Not Yet Selected.

It seems that the committee appointed to select a site for the new feeble minded institute is "making haste slowly." No selections have as yet been made, and it seems that the special committee, composed of Oswald West and Wm. Waldo, has not as yet made any official inspections. Mr. West is very busy with his work as Railroad Commissioner, and inasmuch as he is the personal represen-

tative of the governor it places him in a very delicate position. For this reason, it is understood, that he favored the selection of Mr. Waldo as his associate, in order that whatever is done cannot be laid at the gover-

nor's door, politically. In the meantime Judge Waldo is known to be a man of sterling character and exceptionally good judgment in matters pertaining to lands. If he becomes thoroughly interested in the project he will, by nature, leave no stone unturned, but will make a most searching investigation of every feature of the properties offered. He has already said that he wants the state to have the benefit of the best natural advantages, such as a superior supply of good timber for fuel and running water, as well as an abundance of pure drinking water throughout the year. It is expected that Judge Waldo will probe these points fully, and demand value received for the state. He has already a broad knowledge of most of the property offered, and, if he follows his natural bent, will scrutinize all that is offered just as closely as though he were buying for himself.
