

consider the same, with Alderman Stockton in the chair. Upon the motion of Mr. Greenbaum the committee of the whole favored the awarding of the contract to the Warren Construction Company. The commitete of the whole then rose and Alderman Stockton reported the action of the committee, and moved the adoption of their report, authorizing the city to enter into a contract with the construction company to do the work. The company agrees to do any work that is not specified for cost, with 15 per cent added.

On Established Grade, The trustees of the Willamette University were instructed to put the cement sidewalk that is to be built on State street, between Twelfth and Winter streets, on the grade established by the city ordinance. This will necessitate the removal of the trees along the walk, which caused some discussion.


