

TWENTY THOUSAND MILE TOUR

Syracuse, N. Y., May 1.—Rodney W. Hey, son of the late Geo. W. Hey who became one of the heirs of the Hey estate after a series of complications, intends to take a unique automobile trip this summer, trying to make 20,000 miles in four months and a half. The route is around the border of the United States the automobilist being instructed to "follow the coast and boundary lines as far as good and passable roads will permit." He will take the trip as an experiment for a western automobile company.

Next week Mr. Hey will leave for Anderson, Ind., which he will leave May 15 for New York on a preliminary trial trip. He expects to arrive here about May 20. He will start on his longer journey June 1 and is required to finish by October 15. He believes he can do it in less time than that.

The starting and finishing points are New York city. From there he will go down the Atlantic coast, going through New Brunswick and Trenton, N. J., Philadelphia, Hartford and Baltimore, Md., and Washington. From the national capital he will go to Richmond, Va., then Raleigh and Rockingham, N. C. He will go through Columbia, S. C., Savannah, Ga., Jacksonville, Tallahassee and Pensacola, Fla., reaching nearly the end of the peninsula.

He will come back up the west coast and skirt the Gulf of Mexico by the way of Mobile, Ala., Baton Rouge, La., and the following Texas towns and cities: Orange, Houston, Brenham, Austin, San Antonio, Johnstone, Sanderson, Aragon, Yuleta and El Paso. Then he will follow the Mexican boundary as nearly as practicable, going by way of Deming, New Mexico, Fort Grant, Phoenix and Yuma, Ariz., to White Water, Cal.

Up the Pacific coast will be the next turn of the trip. He will pass these California towns: Los Angeles, Bakersfield, Merced, San Francisco, Sacramento and Reading, and will then go through Jacksonville, Oakland, Salem and Portland, Oregon, to Olympia, Seattle and Spokane, Wash.

The whirl down the northwestern boundary will take in the cities of Helena and Miles City, Mont., Bismarck, N. D., Moorehead, Duluth and St. Paul, Minn. He will go through Madison, Wis., to Chicago. From there he will head for the metropolis passing Toledo and Cleveland, O., Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Utica and Albany, N. Y.

"The itinerary is one I selected," said Mr. Hey today. "I believe it can be done in less than that time specified. I will follow the coast and boundary lines as nearly as possible. From the road maps we have figured that the journey will be about 20,000 miles long. There have been many long automobile trips but this is the only one circling the United States border that I have heard of. All kinds of different conditions will be encountered. I will use a special touring car with friction drive, into which some of my own ideas have been incorporated."

Albert Whittington, of No. 305 South Crouse avenue, will accompany Mr. Hey on the tour. There will, besides, be a mechanic in the car.

FRISCO BUILDING RAPIDLY

San Francisco, May 1.—The reconstruction map of San Francisco which has been issued by the California Promotion committee is certainly a remarkable document. It shows at a glance what has been done toward the rebuilding of San Francisco in the year that has passed since the terrible fire ravaged its business portion, one year ago. It shows that in the year that has passed nearly one-half of the burned district, covering four square miles, has been covered with new structures, either completely and occupied, or in course of construction.

This map taken in connection with the prize panoramic photograph of the committee is the best evidence that can be produced of the fact that while critics have indulged in many wild flights of fevered fancy San Francisco has gone steadily on, with an energy and result unequalled in the history of the whole world. As the catastrophe was of greatest magnitude, so has been the recovery therefrom.

Every one of the eighty odd million dollars in cash which have been expended on reconstruction work during the past year, has counted for a full dollar in result, and the thirty million dollars of this, paid to labor, has gone to bring prosperity to the merchants who plucked victory from seeming defeat. Much has been done toward reconstruction in addition to the actual building of houses.

San Francisco street railway systems were badly demoralized by the fire, but they are now entirely rehabilitated. It cost an immense sum of money to do this, and it is stated by officials of the various roads that a total of \$6,385,462 has been paid out since April 18, 1906, in construction work alone. This does not include operating expenses or any of the regular fixed charges.

The telephone and telegraph companies have been busy since the disaster, and they, too, have spent a large amount in reconstruction work. The actual amount expended, according to the officials of the various companies is \$1,100,000, all of which has gone into reconstruction work.

Water is a prime essential and the Spring Valley Water Works had to bear the early brunt of the battle for reconstruction. During the year just past it has been constantly at work, repairing and replenishing mains and such other parts of the works as were damaged by the disaster. The company has not yet reached the half way point in this work, and it will be fully another year before it has erased all the traces of the calamity.

Gas and electric companies have worked wonders in their rehabilitation of the lighting facilities of San Francisco, and have expended an enormous sum of money to put the city back into its condition as before the fire. New mains have been laid, new wires have been strung throughout the city, and restoration has been thorough, keeping pace with the growth in the burned district. In the two most necessary of all utilities—water and light—there has been a total expenditure of \$3,015,000 during the year.

It will be seen from this that the public utilities have been repaired during the past year at a cost of \$10,170,452.

Estimates based on reports from various buildings trades unions show that, in round numbers, \$20,000,000 have been paid to the workers in those unions during the year.

During the year building permits calling for the expenditure of \$60,189,923 were issued, and material to be used in those buildings was bought during the year to an estimated value of \$30,000,000. In the removal of ruins and debris during the year it is estimated that between \$8,000,000 and \$10,000,000 have been expended in payment of labor and teams. Four thousand five hundred temporary structures were erected in San Francisco immediately after the fire, for which no permits were issued. It is estimated that these structures cost \$5,000,000.

In the rehabilitation of offices and stores in the burned district it is estimated that \$10,000,000 was expended during the year, bringing the grand total of actual cash outlay in reconstruction to \$80,000,000.

As an evidence of the vast amount of business done in San Francisco, the bank clearings for the year are phenomenal, amounting to a total of \$2,074,299,568.15, in the ten months and a half after the resumption of banking business in the city.

Rate Cases in South Carolina.

Washington, May 1.—The cases of the Arreweville Manufacturing company, the Riverside Mills and the Chas. L. Quimby (South Carolina Merchants) cases now before the interstate commerce commission, alleging exorbitant rates of transportation against the Southern Railway and the Clyde Steamship company, et al., one being argued today in this city. R. J. Southall, of Augusta, Ga., the parties, and is arguing against the transportation lines. The contention is that the rate charged on southern cotton goods manufactured by the cotton mills bringing the suits is excessive, when they are shipped to northern or New England points. If the contention of the mills is sustained it will mean a refunding of an immense amount of money to the mills and in addition thereto a reduction on freight rates of the future. These cases aggregate around two millions of dollars in refunded rates of freight paid out to 29 companies of the Pacific trade lines, doing a transportation business with China and Japan.

Plans Tent Work by the Churches.

New York, May 1.—Under the evangelistic committee of New York city for the summer tent and open-air work a rally of the churches takes place tonight in Carnegie hall. Gypsy Smith, the noted revivalist, will be among the speakers. A chorus of 1000 singers has been organized from the Young People's societies. A supplementary meeting is provided for, as the attendance is expected to be very large. Other speakers on the program are the Rev. C. L. Goodell, the Rev. A. F. Schaffner, Rev. J. R. Stevenson and Rev. James B. Ely. One of the features will be pictures showing experiences from the tents. The tent work last year was very successful, and an extra effort will be made this season to extend the scope of the work, with a large number of extra workers, a greater variety of exercises, and a large number of localities undertaken. The workers are highly enthusiastic, and have the signs of victory in their beaming countenances.
