CHRISTIAN SCIENCE TALK.

Rev. Arthur Reeves Vosburgh Will Speak at the Grand Theatre May 14.

Rev. Arthur Reeves Vosburgh, C. S. B., member of the official board of lecturership of the First Church of Christ, Scientists, of Boston, Mass., will lecture in Salem at the Grand theatre, Tuesday evening May 14.

It is the custom of the Christian Science church of this city to provide two complimentary public lectures each year. Mr. Vosburgh's coming will make the twelfth lecture given in Salem on the subject of Christian Science.

Mr. Vosburgh is a graduate of the Presbyterian Theological Seminary at Auburn, and was formerly identified with the work of that denomination. He experienced the efficacy of Christian Science healing some 15 years ago, and since that time has devoted his efforts to the promulgation of this doctrine, as practitioner, teacher and lecturer. HE FACED DEATH.

Watches Elevator Slowly Descend Upon Him.

(Portland Journal.)

Lying at the bottom of the elevator shaft in the Eaton hotel, too seriously injured to move, Night Clerk Glenn Hite lay motionless where he had fallen at an early hour yesterday morning and watched the heavy car descend upon him, expecting his life to be crushed out before help could reach him.

The elevator stopped of its own accord and Hite was rescued a few minutes after the fall by one of the guests in the hotel. Soon after being raised from the shaft he lost consciousness, and was taken to St. Vincent's hospital, where he will recover.

Hite, in response to a call, had gone to a room on the second floor. The elevator is provided with automatic brakes, and it is thought that the car had raised in the shaft after Hite left it, leaving an open space through which he walked on his return. Hite himself has been unable to tell, since being taken to the hospital, how the peculiar accident occurred.

Hite fell two stories and a half, striking on the cement foundation at the bottom of the shaft. Stunned by the fall and suffering intense pain he managed to turn over on his back, and as he did so he glanced up and saw the heavy car descending upon him. Hite reckoned that inside of a few seconds his life would be crushed out.

The horror of the situation nerved him and he struggled to raise himself from his perilous position, but failed. On the verge of losing consciousness, Hite called for help as loudly as possible, and renewed his cries as the heavy car sank within a foot of him. When Louis Bright, a guest of the hotel, rushed from an upstairs room to the unfortunate man's assistance, the elevator had stopped in response to the automatic brakes within six inches of Hite's body.

The car was raised and Hite lost consciousness almost as soon as he was taken from the shaft. No bones were broken by the fall, but he was so severely bruised and shaken up that he was unable to talk intelligibly.
