AURORA HOP NOTES.

Hop Acreage is Increasing in That Neighborhood.

Aurora, Or., May 8.—The only buying in the hop markets of this section is what Henry L. Bents, of this place, is doing. This week he bought 200 bales of hops from Aurora and St. Paul parties at 6 1/2 and 7 cents. The hops are for immediate shipment to England. Rain is badly needed in this section for all kinds of crops. The ground is so dry that it is impossible to cultivate hops. As far as your correspondent can learn from those who are posted in the matter, but very few hop yards have been abandoned or plowed up in this district. On the contrary, more acreage is being put in. The big growers take a cheerful view of the outlook, and while not anticipating any large prices this season, they think the crop will bring a good, reasonable price.

Swears Out His Own Warrant.

Tacoma, May 8.—Born with a silver spoon in his mouth and nursed in the lap of luxury, B. Travis, gentleman, scholar, and the embodiment of refinement, came near turning highwayman Saturday night, lacking only a chance to carry out his demands for other people's money to put his plan into execution.

"Captain, here's my gun and here I am. I want to surrender myself to the police," he began, addressing his remarks to Captain William Olsen of the police department, shortly after midnight Saturday.

The captain, hurriedly surveying the young man, took it in his experienced way a young man who looked anything but the man he said he was.

"I am the son of a prosperous and well-to-do merchant of a middle west town. Until a short time ago I received regular remittances from my father, but he tired of my ability to spend \$500 a month and cut off my allowance. I never had to work and didn't want to begin now. So I just put this raincoat on for a makeup and with the gun I have just handed you I started out to get some easy money. The right chance didn't come to me, and so when I began thinking it over I thought I had better come and give myself up and surrender this 'gat' to you."

The police captain listened to the young man's story, half believing, half doubting. He assured the captain that he was neither drunk nor crazy and insisted upon the captain taking charge of him and of his .32-caliber revolver, with which he intended to enforce a demand for some unsuspecting pedestrian's money.

This afternoon Travis will be arraigned before Police Judge Anderson, charged with carrying concealed weapons. It was one of the strangest cases which the police have had to deal with in a long time, and when the voluntary prisoner is arraigned today the police judge and police will insist upon a more detailed account of the young man's strange career.

FOR A BETTER WATER SUPPLY.

Aurora Will Sink City Well to Increase Flow.

Aurora, May 8.—At the last meeting of the city council it was decided to have Contractor Watson, of Portland, return here with his well-boring outfit and deepen the city water works well to at least 176 feet. The well is now down 128 feet, with a small quantity of water in the pipes, but a test by pumping six or eight hours showed that the flow was not sufficient, and the water too muddy for use, except for fire purposes. The council is determined to go down until a good flow of water is found suitable for all purposes.

Parrott and Aiken Named.

C. W. Parrott and J. C. Aiken, both of Roseburg, were appointed this morning by Governor Chamberlain members of the Second Southern Oregon District Agricultural Society for the term ending May 1, 1909. The Southern Oregon district comprises the counties of Douglas, Coos and Curry, to which \$1800 is appropriated by the state for the term of two years, to carry on county fairs.

Mysteries of the Black Sea.

Few persons, probably, other than those engaged in the pursuit of science, are aware that the Black sea presents an interest of its own to the zoologist and the geologist shared by no other part of the ocean at the present day.

Throughout the great part of the ocean the bottom is the dwelling place of a number of creatures whose business it is to consume the bodies of the members of the surface fauna which after death sink to the bottom. In the Black sea, however, says the Field, owing to special geological events, such scavengers are totally wanting over the greater part of the bottom, so that the carcasses of the creatures which fall from above are left to decompose, which they speedily do at the comparatively high temperature of the water.

By their decomposition two soluble compounds—carbonate of ammonia and sulphuretted hydrogen—are developed in enormous quantities; while no free life, except such as it introduced from the Mediterranean, is left. The volume of sulphuretted hydrogen is so great as to poison the water from the greatest depth (1227 fathoms) to within about 100 fathoms of the surface to such a degree that life, except for a few bacteria, is absolutely impossible.

The circumstances has a double interest—first, that it is absolutely unique at the present day, and secondly, that it seems to offer an almost exact parallel to the state of affairs that existed at the inconceivably remote epoch when the oldest known sedimentary rocks were laid down as mud on the ancient sea bottom.
