Has Served 26 Years in the Oregon Penitentiary

Governor Chamberlain yesterday pardoned Henry Von Wintzingerode who was serving a life term. It is probable that executive clemency was never exercised in a more deserving case. The pardon gives publicity to another kindly act, that of Moses Taylor, a rich Umatilla county farmer, who was himself but a few days ago the recipient of executive clemency, and who, in his new-found liberty, did not forget the friend he had left within the prison walls. Taylor took up Wintzingerode's case, and brought it to the attention of the governor, with the result noted.

Mintzingerode is now 54 years of age, 26 of which he has passed within the walls of the penitentiary. He was sentenced from Washington county in 1881, upon conviction of murder in the second degree. Many have come and many have gone during his time at the pen, which to him was slated to go on forever. He was the "dean" of the prison, having served longer than any other prisoner, and, while the weary years dragged by for him, 3000 other prisoners have come and gone.

During all these years he has never violated a prison rule, and has earned all the merits possible to him under the law. Of his crime the writer knows nothing, but surely it has been explained.

Mr. Taylor has not only been the means of securing his pardon, but has promised to take the pardoned man to his own home, and to take care of him so long as he lives.

Trumbull Appointed Building Commissioner.

Labor Commissioner Hoff yesterday appointed the last of the three building and factory inspectors, as is provided by the new law relating to the inspection of factories and work shops. Edward D. Trumbull, of Salisbury, Baker county, is the appointee, and will begin the performance of the duties of his office about the first of June. He is at present foreman of the Wisconsin Lumber Company's planing mill, and Commissioner Hoff feels that he has secured a man whose qualifications are such as to make him "just the man for the place."

Big Religious Convention.

Forsythe, Ga., May 8.—From Virginia to Texas Congregational Methodists have bent their way to Monroe county, Georgia, where today there is being held one of the most notable conventions in the history of the church since its organization on May 8, 1852. A delegation of about 50 people comes from Atlanta, headed by Dr. Hunt, D. D., of the Bible school. The convention is being held in Zion church on the site where the denomination sprang into existence and in the oldest church building now standing in the denomination. Several forward movements of the church will be announced before the close of the convention. About a year ago the church was established in Atlanta Bible school for the furtherance of the work within its borders and also as an undenominational Bible study institution. It has been wonderfully successful, and is now striving for \$100,000 as an endowment fund, with which to enlarge its operations. The official organ of the church, carried a story last week concerning the probable establishment at once of a gigantic publishing plant to do their own and a general publishing business. The location of the plant has not been decided upon. The church is an offshoot of the Methodist Episcopal church of the South. Feeling that the system made its ministerial force servants of men rather than of God, a number of the brethren met in Monroe county in 1852, and started the church, which today reaches from Virginia to Missouri, and out to Texas all along the borders of the coast from Texas back to Virginia.

Bridge Cost Increases.

New York, May 8.—From the detailed report which Comptroller Metz, bureau of municipal investigation has made to Comptroller Metz of the progress made in the cost of the Blackwell's island bridge shows that the bridge will cost the city not less than \$18,000,000, which is \$6,000,000 more than the original estimate. In the original estimate the land required was valued at \$3,148,500. The report to the comptroller says this land may now cost \$67,000,000 or even \$80,000,000.

Camphor Making in South and West

Pittsburg, Pa., May 8.—"Why not make camphor at home? Camphor is now an oriental monopoly. We prefer an American monopoly for obvious reasons." This was only one of the striking statements made by James Wilson, secretary of agriculture, to the American club. Wilson says:

"For years the department has been distributing camphor tree seed, and thousands of trees are now growing throughout the southern and in Pacific coast states. Two years ago a serious effort was made to develop the manufacture of camphor from these trees. With improvement in manufacturing processes, satisfactory results have been accomplished and a large manufacturing concern is now building up a camphor grove of 2000 acres in Florida, from which it hopes to make its camphor. This firm uses more than \$500,000 worth of camphor every year.

Maintain Canal Zone Is American Territory.

New York, May 8.—To determine whether the Panama canal zone is American territory or not, the David Kaufman & Sons company, has instituted a suit before the board of United States general appraisers to a tariff dispute, concerning the admittance of old scrap iron and steel discarded by the engineers at Panama. Notwithstanding the fact that congress in the act of March 2, 1905 expressly provided that "all laws affecting imports of articles, goods, wares, merchandise and entry of persons coming from the canal zone, Isthmus of Panama, and seeking entry into any state or territory of the United States and the District of Columbia, the importers raise the point of unconstitutionality against the law. It has been stated by representatives of tool and engineering supply firms and other contractors.
