SECOND CLASS IN EUROPE

Another delusion of the guide is the advice to ride second on the railroads of Europe. It is pointed out that first class is frequently the same car, and this is a great impression on the experienced traveler, particularly if the journey is limited. Landing at Southampton, Havre, Antwerp, Liverpool, you are at once conveyed to London or Paris on "laminated" under the same exact conditions that have prevailed on your trip. But thereafter you are at your own resources, and if you are wise you will see to it that your seat is always engaged well ahead. If you travel second class between cities that correspond to New York and Philadelphia, say, you will find intercourse is frequent and generous you will most likely have stood up in all second class compartments. To get a second-class ticket between Vienna and Budapest, for example, is about like boarding a train for Coney Island at Brooklyn on a summer Sunday afternoon. And if you do get a seat, nobody eats sandwiches and sips on your lap. Another point to be remembered is that in Europe you cannot engage a whole sleeping compartment for yourself, as you can here. You have to show a ticket for each berth. Therefore it behooves the person traveling alone at night to seek out before arranging a trip some suitable companion, for parties of three or five or any number to make similar provisions.—The Traveler Magazine.
