### Proposals Invited.

Proposals invited for supplies for the Oregon State Penitentiary for the period ending December 31, 1907.

Sealed bids for drugs, drygoods, groceries, butter, leather and findings, hardware, flour and meat, etc., will be received in the office of the superintendent of the State Penitentiary, until Wednesday, June 12th, at 2 o'clock p. m., at which time they will be opened.

A deposit of \$200 in cash or certified check, payable to the superintendent, must accompany each bid for meat and flour, and all other bids must be accompanied by an amount equal to 10 per cent of the amount of the bid.

Samples to accompany all bids, where practicable. The right is reserved to reject any and all bids and to accept or reject any portion of a bid. On each envelope should be inscribed the nature of the bid. Goods of Oregon manufacture or production will receive preference, other things being equal.

All goods and supplies must be delivered to the penitentiary within twenty days after the contract is awarded.

Schedules of the various lines of goods to be bid on will be furnished upon application to the superintendent.

### THE PRESIDENT AND RACE SUICIDE.

We cannot undertake to speak as positively as does the President when he brands as "criminals" those parents who can have children, but who refuse to have them in number sufficient to maintain some rate of population increase, which would mean families averaging four or more rather than two or three. But he further says:

"The writer's statement that 'physical defects go hand in hand with a large number of children, both in the rich and the poor,' is simply not true, as he could tell at a glance by looking up, for instance, the fact that athletes are most apt to be found in fair-sized families. I am not speaking now of families of inordinate size, though even as to such the high standard of health and strength among the French-Canadians, for instance, is astonishing, but of those of half a dozen children or thereabouts. Let him look up any serious statistics, or study any author worth reading on the subject at all, including Benjamin Franklin, and he will see that in the ordinary family of but one or two children there is apt to be lower vitality than in a family of four or five or more."

The President appears to be saying that those who live most in harmony with natural laws will most contribute to the health and strength of the race. The edict of nature, no less than the divine command, is that man shall multiply and replenish the earth, and no undue and extraordinary interference with this edict can be made without injurious results in the long run to the physical well-being of man. But he assumes the superiority of large families to small in all conditions of life, and refers to Benjamin Franklin as an authority on conditions

which are altogether different from those he knew. The workers in charity today have some knowledge of the physical and moral stamina and the value to the state of large families reared nowadays under the stress of our unequal civilization. If there be one evil that they constantly encounter, it is that of a family of children going down to lower levels because of the inability of their parents to bring them up decently. The question whether a man and woman who can maintain two or three children in comfort and bring them up creditably should be fulfilling the "laws of nature" by producing seven or eight or more, with the result of increasing poverty and ultimate pauperism, is not so easy to dispose of.—Springfield (Mass.) Republican.

**What Else Could Be Expected.**  
Where is the decent law-upholding element of San Francisco's population in these times of rioting and bloodshed in the city's streets? That element is responsible, primarily, for the inefficiency of the police service and consequently for the bloody tragedy enacted by strikers and strike breakers. Even in San Francisco the law-abiding classes constitute only a small minority of the community.

Why do not the great majority of the people show something of the grit of their predecessors at a time when rioters, in face of the impotent police, are demonstrating to the world that San Francisco is no fit or safe dwelling place for order-loving people? If the San Francisco of today were worthy of its early fame there would be no such disgraceful spectacle in its streets as is witnessed there now. Law-breakers and their official aids and abettors would get their deserts with but little formality if the spirit of the "fifties" animated the present generation.

But what else than riotous conditions can be expected in a community that tolerates high public officials who are under indictment for crimes punishable by terms in state prison? The mayor of San Francisco, who should be wearing convict garb instead of exercising the functions of chief executive of the city, is truckling to the rioters. The supervisors, who are self-confessed criminals, are unheard of at this critical juncture. The criminal records leave nothing better to expect, however, from the city authorities of San Francisco. It is to the sane and sober mass of the people that outsiders look for drastic action in this emergency. The people are the highest law in mundane affairs and the lamentable condition of San Francisco calls upon that law for justice as a last resort.

Such a condition as is presented in San Francisco would be impossible in Los Angeles. In the first place, this city is officially sound, while San Francisco is officially rotten from skin to core. In the second place, if Los Angeles had the misfortune to be officially disgraced by disloyal public servants, the loyal sentiment of the community would assert itself promptly and effectively. Where is the San Francisco spirit of the "fifties"?—Los Angeles Herald.
