ARE ART OBJECTS IN "DU BARRY"

Brought From Madame Du Barry's Chateau at Versailles

Just before "Du Barry," the play which Mrs. Leslie-Carter has so fully triumphed and in which she stars at the Grand Opera House, was produced in New York. It ran for over two years, and the story of the sale of the contents of the original Madame Du Barry's chateau at Versailles was made public. The house was magnificently furnished, and a large share of the treasures were secured for the production of "Du Barry." As three of the objects have great historical as well as intrinsic value a description of them is of interest. The first object is a tea table, mahogany, ornamented with chased bronze, dull gilt, the top composed of seven pieces of Sevres porcelain, six of which represent rural objects surrounded by garlands of flowers and in the center a Turkish subject after Van Loo. Another object is a fire-screen, decorated with a hunting subject showing stags and wild boars. On the overlap are various game and attributes entwined in branches and bas-reliefs of birds, with dogs heads and paws. The screen is of oak, ivy, and berries, the whole carved, dull gilt. This is fifteen inches high and twenty-one inches broad. A third object is a glazed whitewood commode on four bracket feet, three in front and two drawers with pictures on Sevres porcelain of the three front panels are after Van Loo. The whole comes in frames, friezes, carytides, and cramps and the tall piece, ornamented with lions heads. The top is in dull, gilded bronze, the top of white marble, and the dimensions two feet eight inches in height, three and a half feet across and eighteen inches deep.
